

EG INTERVIEW PROJECT



Please interview **THREE ADULTS** over 30 years old. You are required to interview the following:

- At least one adult from your home or adult relative
- a person who is not related to you or does not live in your home
(These people can be Minarets teachers, staff members, or friends.)

No more than one person from the class section can interview any interview subject, so you must first ask if someone else from your section has already interviewed your subject.

Ideally this is an in-person interview, but you can interview the subject over the phone or via email.

1. Please take a picture of the subject of your interview or have him/her send you a photo.
2. Please ask your subject the following questions. You can use this form for your interview answers--[Interview Form](#)
 - a. Who are you and what do you do for a living?
 - b. What is one economic/financial decision you made that was good? Why was it good?
 - c. What is one economic/financial decision you made that was bad? Why was it bad?
 - d. What are two economic/financial issues that need fixing?
 - e. What is one piece of economic/financial advice you would like to give our class?
 - f. Do you have a family? If so, how many children do you have?
 - g. How do you view the US government?
 - h. How do you view the California government?
 - i. How do you view the local government?
 - j. What are two political/government issues that need fixing?
 - k. What is one piece of advice you would like to give our class regarding the government?
 - l. What is your version of the American Dream?
3. Create a Google Preso using the following template
 - a. [Interview Preso](#)
4. Use Easybib to cite your three interviews and your three photos.

5. Present your Preso in two minutes before the class.
