This week's Parsha

Genesis 44:18 - 47:27 Vayigash

In part 3 of 4 Parshaot telling the story of Jacob and his family, we open with Joseph (long presumed dead by his brothers and father) engaging in conversation with his brothers who have been sent to buy food. Not knowing that he is speaking with his long lost brother, Judah begs, pleads and butters up his brother in an attempt to buy some food.

The truly amazing part of this story is not the reunion of Joseph and his brothers, but the selfless way that Joseph practices forgiveness. His brothers, who treated him so poorly, were in front of him begging for sustenance. Joseph quickly puts an end to their begging and in fact dismisses everyone but one of them from his chambers in order to avoid more embarrassment to his family.

In Genesis 45:2 it says that Joseph cried so loud that all of Egypt and the house of Pharoah heard his cries. Joseph, who should have been incredibly upset with his brothers was able to put all of the anger and hostility behind him and instead turn his focus towards love and forgiveness. It is not easy to forgive and move on but I hope that we can emulate Joseph and practice forgiveness.

Judaic Studies Eric

This week we started to prepare for our Shabbat service by discussing the concept of Keva and Kavanah. Keva being the way things are done (bowing at appropriate times, the call and response of prayer). Kavanah is the intention behind the prayer or how we connect to the prayers. In preparation for our service the students have begun to look at prayers and think creatively about the deeper meaning and their own personal connection to the text.

Your students should be able to explain the concept of Keva and Kavanah as it relates to prayer.

We are learning a new story by Paul Kor "The Best Color" In this book the students get to expand their vocabulary words and sentences structure. The students are working hard on their reading and writing skills.	Ask your child what his/her favorite color and why?
Science Mr. Abelson	Third grade continued exploring magnets. Specifically students made attempts to clean off magnets that had iron filings on the magnets. Students also took a closer look at strong magnets floating down copper pipes, learning that some metals are magnetic, some are not magnetic and some are semi-magnetic. Students also conducted an experiment to copy and print out magnetic lines of magnets that are close together.	Is copper magnetic? How easy is it to remove iron filings from a magnet?
Art Miss Mimi	This week, third grade began to create self-portraits inspired by Fauvism.	What is unique about fauvism?
Technology Daniel	This week, third graders were introduced to Google Slides. Google Slides is an app used by our school and is comparable to Microsoft Powerpoint in that it gives students a powerful toolset to create a slide deck. We talked about some of the most commonly used tools such as creating new slides, formatting our slides, and inserting text, photos, and links. Students were then given time to create a practice intro slide and were asked to share the slide deck with me via email.	What kinds of projects would Google Slides be useful for?





