Language-intensive replacements may include a year living in a French theme house, intensive summer study, etc.

##Seniors must work with their advisor in the French and Francophone Studies department to create an ePortfolio about their progress in the curriculum and total experience as a major; to be submitted to the department by April 15 of senior year.

2) French courses numbered 100-109, 200-209, 300-309, and 400-409 count only towards the Language requirement.

*Majors must take a minimum of three units at the 300+ level, two of which must be taken at the Tacoma campus, including one during the senior year.

Two (2) of the International Politics units can be selected from: PG 311, 321, 331, 332, 333, 334, 335, 336, 339, 347, 360, 382, 385 (applies to FLIA for Politics and Government majors and minors only); SOAN 318, 340. **These courses also satisfy the Social Sciences (SS/HS) Division requirement.

***Three Business or Economics (3) units from: ECON 101, 240, 268, 271; BUS 305, 310, 370, 435 (prerequisite BUS 315), 475; IPE 205, 321. Only one IPE class may count toward the FLIA major. These courses also satisfy the SS/HS Division requirement.

#Majors in the French and Francophone Studies department are required to compile an ePortfolio of their work, in consultation with a faculty advisor in the department, and submit it to the department by April 15 of their senior year.
