COURSE DESCRIPTION

The purpose of this course is to provide grade 10 students integrated language arts study in reading, writing, listening, speaking, and language for college or career preparation.

 - crafting coherent, supported informative/expository essays
 - writing narratives
 - writing using text based evidence and reasoning
- effective speaking, listening, and viewing strategies, emphasizing use of evidence to support or refute a claim
- collaboration with peers
