ABOUT QRCA

One of the main objectives of the conference and the emerging scholar's colloquium is to join forces with local initiatives to promote and stimulate the production of Qualitative Research and Critical Accounting (QRCA) in the Portuguese and Spanish-speaking countries of Latin America.

Furthermore, the conference also aims to help build meaningful bridges between researchers in the region committed to QRCA and other international academic communities working on these topics. Although the network is closely related to accounting, the concept is approached from a broad perspective, so you will see in the "topics of interest" of this call that other areas of knowledge are welcome at this conference under a critical approach.

The QRCA initiative does not intend to offer magic recipes on how to engage in research and publish it in an academic journal. However, it is realistic to say that participants can take advantage of the following potential benefits:

- To be aware that they are not alone in conducting qualitative or critical research and that there is a growing community of researchers in Latin America.
- Enable participants to expand their network in the growing community of QRCA.
- Connect QRCA 2024 participants with leading exponents of the topics, research and methodologies they pursue (including editors, publishers, reviewers and reviewers of leading international academic journals).
- Expose participants to in-depth discussions on the criteria for evaluating qualitative, interpretive, and critical research.
- Present their work in progress to an audience of qualitative researchers and receive constructive feedback from this audience.
- Participate in discussions about the challenges and opportunities of publishing QRCA articles in high-impact international journals that accept QRCA articles.
- Participate in discussions on how to make research in Latin American environments of interest to an international audience.

At the Conference and at the Emerging Scholars Colloquium, members of the editorial staff of several academic journals will participate and there will also be a special session with the editors of these journals:

- Presentation of journals and special issues by editors/directors. Journals confirmed at the moment: Costos y Gestión (IAPUCO, Arg), Critical Perspectives on Accounting (USA), Escritos Contables y de Administración (UNS, Arg), Economía y Estadística (UNC, Arg), INNOVAR (UNAL, Colombia).**

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

Any academic, researcher or graduate student (doctorate or master's) committed to the QRCA or its topics of interest is invited to participate in the Conference and the Emerging Scholars Colloquium, provided that the proposed research follows a qualitative methodology and/or reflects the critical or interpretive paradigm of social research.

The paper options are:

- **Submission of Full Papers (FULL PAPERS):** Authors can submit articles of up to 15,000 words. The most advanced papers will be considered. Doctoral and master's students whose thesis or dissertation is nearing completion can also submit a full paper (in addition to their work in the Graduate Consortium).
- **Submission of Articles in Progress (WORKING PAPERS):** Authors can submit works in progress or extended abstracts of up to 5,000 words. The organizing committee expects to receive unfinished material, but which presents a high degree of originality and relevance to the topics of interest.
- **Emerging Scholars Colloquium:** Postgraduate students (PhD and MSc) can submit a 2,000-word abstract of their thesis or dissertation proposal, specifying the stage of their PhD or MSc work.

Language: Please note that, due to their international character, presentations to the QRCA conference and Emerging Scholars Colloquium can be written in Portuguese, Spanish, English or French. **If the paper is accepted, the organizing committee recommends that the presentation slides be prepared in English** to promote feedback from the international audience. The languages spoken during the conference and the consortium will be Portuguese, Spanish, English, and French. The intention is that each participant will be able to communicate in the language in which they feel comfortable, but there will be no

simultaneous translation during all of the QRCA 2024 activities (only during the plenary sessions).
