Dear Arapahoe Parents,

August 2025

Welcome to a brand **new school year at Arapahoe High School!** A special welcome goes out to all our **freshmen and new students**. I'm confident you'll find this an exciting place to learn. Arapahoe is full of new adventures, opportunities, challenges, and fun.

As I begin my fourteenth and final year as your principal, I'm filled with gratitude and anticipation. After 36 incredible years in education, I'll be retiring at the end of the 2025–2026 school year. I'll share more details about the process for hiring a new principal as the year goes on. For now, I look forward to one last meaningful year of learning, growing, and connecting with all of you.

Each fall, I like to **share my background with our AHS family**, especially for those of you who are new to Arapahoe. I graduated from the University of Nevada, Reno, with a bachelor's degree in biology and a minor in chemistry. **I taught high school science (biology, chemistry, anatomy/physiology, and physical science) for 10 years** before moving into administration. While teaching, I sponsored a variety of student activities, including Link Crew and Student Council. I have also coached the sport of cheerleading throughout my career. I have spent the **last 25 years as a high school administrator** (8 of those at AHS as an assistant principal in the Office of Curriculum and Instruction before becoming the principal). My husband and I love Colorado. Our daughter is an AHS Class of 2021 alum, and our son is now also an alum, having recently graduated with the Class of 2025. We are extremely proud to call Centennial our home and are grateful to be part of the Arapahoe and Littleton Public Schools communities.

I would like to extend special congratulations to our most recent graduates of The Class of 2025. They earned some of the most impressive awards and accomplishments to date! More than 92% of them have been accepted for fall enrollments at colleges, universities, trade schools, and other post-secondary educational programs throughout the country. Nearly \$34 million in scholarship money was offered to the Class of 2025, including multiple full-tuition scholarships. We are very proud of the Class of 2025. They will be remembered fondly for their kindness and positive leadership for years to come. We will miss them and wish them all the best as they seek new adventures in the next chapter of their lives!

Summer is an opportunity to continue learning through courses, reading, and/or reflecting and planning. I have enjoyed learning this summer, alongside our AHS administrative team, in ways that have helped me grow both professionally and personally. A highlight of my summer learning was spent with my colleagues in

June. We had a tremendous opportunity to attend a **Jimmy Casas Culturize Institute** in Chicago. Collectively, we attended several sessions that provided us with important educational updates at the state and national levels, and heard from a variety of motivational speakers on educational leadership. Additionally, we were able to spend quality time planning and preparing for the school year ahead.

As we begin the new year, it is a great time to reset and focus on academic success. When we return in August, every freshman (as well as upperclassmen who pre-ordered them) will be provided with a hard copy of the 2025-2026 AHS Student Planner. It contains all AHS student policies. Whether you ordered a planner or not, all students are held to the policies contained in the document linked above. Student success in the classroom is dependent upon daily attendance. We highly value the strong instruction our students receive from our outstanding faculty and staff. Therefore, we need your help in ensuring your student is here on time, every day, and is ready to learn! Please review all AHS and LPS student policies with your Warrior and let us know if you have any questions.

Physical presence is critical, and being engaged and mentally present is even more important. The Littleton Public Schools Board of Education approved LPS Board Policy JICJ, a Personal Technology Device (PTD) Policy, that was implemented in the 2024-2025 school year. Research points to strong evidence of causation between the rise of social media, amplified by smartphones, and the decline in adolescent mental health. Once again this year, the expectation is that all cell phones will be placed in the classroom wall pockets and turned off for the duration of every class period. Our block bell schedule provides four (5-minute) passing periods, a 36-minute lunch, and over 90% of student schedules for the upcoming school year indicate at least one off period. That said, there are reasonable windows provided throughout the school day for students to contact or return messages from parents, guardians, and friends. Rest assured, in the case of a family emergency, our staff will gladly facilitate connecting you with your student. We found this policy to be extremely helpful in keeping students engaged and focused during class time. Parent support has been greatly appreciated, and we need you to continue to partner with us and discuss with your Warrior the importance of being on time, engaged, and present every period every day.

As part of the Littleton Public Schools, AHS remains committed to the goal of preparing 100% of our students for meaningful post-secondary opportunities. The work will continue to unfold collaboratively in our weekly Professional Learning Community (PLC) teacher meetings every Wednesday. Arapahoe has developed a very successful Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) model where we can intentionally answer PLC questions 3 and 4 (What do we do if they have learned it? And what do we do if they have not?). One of these interventions is our TRIBE class, which will be held 4 times a week on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. Most TRIBES will be Enrichment TRIBES where students will be able to access academic intervention and/or extension from their current teachers, or spend the time working on upcoming and/or missing assignments. Students may be "pulled" by their teachers for enrichment, or they can self-select teachers for specific help through Infinite Campus. Details on the process will be explained to students through TRIBE classes. Community TRIBE lessons will focus on important school-wide or grade-level specific projects, activities, messages, and or events. These days are intended to build community and a positive culture in our school. TRIBE is an assigned class for every Warrior, and students will receive 0.125 elective credits per semester on a Pass/Fail basis. The Pass will not impact their GPA, but a failing grade will have a slight negative impact. Therefore, attendance in TRIBE is critical. Please review this letter I sent out in June for further details on TRIBE, which includes the **updated bell schedule** as well as the **grading policy** for the class. We value our TRIBE class and expect that you will support us in our efforts by encouraging your Warrior to take advantage of these classes every week.

Arapahoe provides an outstanding learning environment. As your students begin their new school year, there will be times they struggle and need a little more time and extra support. There are a variety of interventions available for individual students. Unscheduled time encourages students to manage time, to advocate for themselves, and to take personal responsibility for their learning. In addition to getting help from teachers during TRIBE, teachers are available every block to offer subject-specific assistance and tutoring. It is inherent in our culture to help each student achieve. Therefore, even if your student's teacher does not share the same unscheduled time with your student, any teacher in the given department will be ready and willing to help them. We encourage our students in grades 9-12 to have at least one unscheduled hour during their week. Our Academic Study Center is also available each period to all students. The Study Center offers tutoring, goal-setting, and assistance with organization and study tips. It can be utilized on a drop-in basis or can be taken as a class for pass/fail credit. Student self-referrals and parent referrals to the Academic Study Center are accepted. Contact your student's counselor or administrator if you have questions about the Study Center. Arapahoe faculty and staff are here for YOU! To that end, please <u>click here</u> for an easy reference to **contacts by grade-level** for **administrators**, counselors, and school psychologists, should you have any questions or concerns that we can help you with throughout the course of this year.

Hey freshmen! Don't forget to **record your summer** reading in this <u>Google Form</u>. I am proud of our freshmen for completing this assignment each summer. In this technological age in which so many of us are conditioned to reading on the Internet, summaries, text messages, paragraphs, and quick reads, we are finding that many teenagers do not often read full novels. Completion of these books will enhance confidence to accomplish tougher assignments later. Also, many of these summer reading books will be discussed and reviewed in freshman English classes early in the semester.

The first day of school for all freshmen will be Monday, August 11th. All freshmen must report to the AHS Sitting Eagle Gymnasium promptly at 8:20 a.m. for Link Crew Orientation. The first day for all other students will be on Tuesday, August 12th. We will begin classes with a <u>BLACK/ODD day TRIBE schedule</u>. All students will report directly to TRIBE on this day! Please note the start, end, and PLC times for the year.

While always striving for improvement, Arapahoe is one of the best high schools in the country. I value the generosity, support, love, and partnership we have with our parent/guardian community. With wonderful teenagers, supportive parents, and a quality faculty, we have the perfect combination to nurture students academically, socially and emotionally and to prepare 100% of them for meaningful post-secondary opportunities. We continue to be amazed at the intelligence, resilience, compassion for others, spirit, resourcefulness, and work ethic of our Warriors. Thank you for sending them to Arapahoe.

Attendance Office

Attendance in high school is mandatory. It is of crucial importance that students attend school every day. Every attempt should be made to schedule appointments during non-school hours and/or during a student's unscheduled time/lunch. Parents/Guardians are the only members of the family who may excuse an absence or tardy. Per AHS policy, these must be excused within 24 hours after the absence.

You may use the Infinite Campus Absence Request tool $\underline{\textbf{OR}}$ call the Attendance Line.

Absence Excusals must include the following information:

- 1. Student's full name, spelling out the last name
- 2. Your relation to the student
- 3. Date of absence and specific time/class period, if applicable
- 4. Specific reason for absence-"personal" is not specific enough per LPS/AHS policy *Acceptable excusals may be reviewed in the LPS Student Code of Conduct.

Student Policies

One of the major objectives of formal education is to teach student citizenship and responsibility. We believe that this is of primary importance in today's society. Arapahoe High School students recognize the conduct appropriate for a given situation and they behave themselves accordingly. We expect that this custom will continue and that students will exhibit the courtesy that has brought many compliments to our school.

Please refer to the LPS Code of Conduct for a comprehensive list of all student behavioral expectations.

At Arapahoe, we don't have numerous rules, but the ones we have...we enforce:

- 1. Everyone has the right to learn (and no one has the right to interfere with the learning of others).
- 2. We believe that everyone's dignity, welfare, and material possessions should be respected.
- 3. Everyone is expected to attend all scheduled classes.
- 4. Students are not to gather or loiter in the bathrooms at any time during the school day.
- 5. Individual teachers may have additional expectations about student behavior for their classes. Please do not prop or open doors that are intended to remain locked for people (including students) on the outside. Students are our best eyes and ears on campus with regard to safety.
- 6. Public displays of affection are not allowed (kissing, sitting on laps, etc.).
- 7. Students are not permitted to gamble on campus.

Student Dress Code

- 1. Students are expected to wear clothing that is appropriate for school and the learning environment. It must appropriately cover traditionally private parts of the body. Clothing must be worn as intended by the manufacturers. Undergarments (any type of bra including sports bras, boxers, briefs, etc.) must be covered.
- 2. Tops must have straps. Bra straps do not count as straps under a top.
- 3. Tops that mimic bras of any kind are not allowed.
- 4. TUBE TOPS MUST BE COVERED AT SCHOOL.
- 5. Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times.
- 6. Offensive slogans which could be considered sexist, racist, vulgar, promote or display weapons, alcohol, tobacco, or drug use are unacceptable on any form of clothing including hats.
- 7. Robes, togas, and/or slippers with soft bottoms are not allowed.
- 8. Faces must be able to be seen and recognized.
 - a. Hoods/hoodies are not to be worn "up" in school so as to be able to easily identify Students.
 - b. No sunglasses are to be worn in the school. Sunglasses prescribed for a concussion or medical condition will require a doctor's note.
 - c. Hats may be worn during the school day. However, teachers have the discretion to ask students to remove them in individual classrooms.
 - d. Masks or excessive markings on the face are not allowed unless required for health purposes.
- 9. Clothing reflecting gang affiliation is not permitted.
- 10. Jewelry or clothing that is spiked, harmful, or in any way intimidating to others is not acceptable.
- 11. For safety purposes, oversized or full-length coats are not to be worn when inside the building. Every student has a locker issued for this purpose.

LPS/AHS Personal Technology Device Policy

LPS District-Wide Cell Phone Policy:

In an effort to curb the damaging/distracting effects of cell phones on kids of all ages, the unified LPS cell phone policy is as follows for the 24-25 school year: For purposes of this policy, "personal technology device" (PTD) includes any privately owned portable technology device, including but not limited to cell phones, wearable technology, cameras, and all other hand-held electronic communication and data storage devices.

In High Schools, students shall not access PTDs during instructional periods except at the teacher's discretion. Teachers can seek approval from their administration for limited student access to PTDs. Student use of PTDs with cameras and/or video recording capabilities is prohibited in locker rooms, bathrooms or any other location where such use could violate another person's reasonable expectation of privacy.

Violation of this policy or any other district, school or classroom rule or regulation on student use of PTDs may result in disciplinary measures and/or temporary confiscation of the PTD. If the building principal or designee believes a student's possession or use of a PTD may involve a violation of the law, the building principal or designee may also refer the matter to law enforcement.

At Arapahoe, our expectation in the classroom is the following:

- 100% compliance of the use of wall pockets for cell phones including TRIBE, Study
- Center, and Student Assistant classes.
- Phones must be turned off.
- Phones are to remain in the pockets unless they are being used for an instructional
 activity directed by the teacher. This includes during any bathroom breaks or classroom
 brain breaks.
- Teachers are welcome to create playlists for classes if there is a desire to play music during class. Students are not allowed to use their phones even with airpods/earbuds/headphones to listen to music during class.
- Smart watches that become a distraction will be expected to be turned into the wall pocket.
- Airpods/earbuds/headphones should be stowed out of sight unless they are being used for a specific instructional activity directed by the teacher.

Consistent Consequences at Arapahoe Include:

After a teacher-student intervention of a conversation and a phone call/email home at a minimum, the following consequences may be imposed:

- Teacher may hold the phone for the class period and call/email home as soon as they
- are able
- Teacher and student may call parent together from the student's phone
- Teacher may write a detention
- Teacher may refer student to grade-level administrator

Parking

Student parking is provided in the east and west parking lots and is designated by yellow striping and signs. Areas not reserved for student parking are designated for staff and visitors by white striping. Seniors and juniors may purchase parking stickers for \$50.00 on a space available basis. **Freshmen and**

sophomores will be given parking privileges on a space available basis. Because space is limited in the student parking lot, the Assistant Principal for Student Services may limit the number of stickers and set up a waiting list on a first come-first served basis. The Fire Department inspects the parking lot on a regular basis. They often phone the Sheriff's Office if student cars block fire lanes. The Sheriff's Deputy will write tickets of their own volition. Parking fines are also assessed by AHS Campus Supervisors for parking without a parking sticker or parking in a fire lane, designated non-parking space or handicapped space. Students parking in the east lot designated for staff and visitors may be ticketed/towed/booted. Parking fines are \$15.00 for each violation. Boots will be applied after the 4th violation and a \$25.00 boot removal fee will be assessed. Boots may be applied and parking privileges may be revoked for flagrant or persistent violations. Loitering in parked cars is prohibited. Students are responsible for knowing the rules and regulations they agreed to and signed during schedule pickup.

Please note the following:

Cost for parking is \$50.00 and you will pay through the <u>Infinite Campus portal</u>. If you have questions about payment, please contact our AHS Bookkeeper, Mrs. Ronald, at <u>Ironald@lps.k12.co.us</u>. You must **ALSO** complete <u>this Google Form</u> with all pertinent information for the vehicle you will be parking on campus. The form can also be found on the AHS Main Website. **BOTH of these steps must be completed to become registered for a permit**. Failure to do so will place you on the waitlist when permits sell out.

Please note: We are only able to accept payments of cash or check for parking permits purchased during schedule pickup. *Credit card payments can be made through Infinite Campus again on August 6th.

Students who have pre-paid for their passes **and** who have completed the vehicle information Google form will receive their passes during schedule pickup days. Seniors on August 4th and juniors on August 5th. You will also sign a card that states you are aware of, and will abide by, the rules and regulations of having a permit and parking in the lot. 




