Financial Statements (Dave Coffman)

- Received a clean opinion on the audit- this is what we want to receive.
- Overall assets up 500K+
- Significantly higher cash balance
- Accounts receivable higher than previously @ 124K
- Liabilities down 316K from prior year
 - Additional paydown on long term debt
 - Net pension liability
- Overall- substantial bottom line
 - New funding for the year 300K+
 - Paycheck protection program was included as revenue in the current year
- Overall- big increases in overall revenue
- Total expenses down 254K from prior year
 - Instruction expenses
 - Remote
 - Change in overall environment
 - Payroll
- Cash on hand
 - End of 2021 had 162 days versus 101 from previous year
- Footnote #2
 - 1.2 million of funding above and beyond federal deposit limits. Required disclosure of risk. Not a recommendation to change
- Footnote #5
 - Retirement plans. As a charter school, not much discretion on retirement plans. 27% of very dollar paid on salary goes into retirement pay.
- Footnote- Long term debt
 - Refinance of loans at lower rate.

- o 4.6 million due in the next 10 years
- Context- the COVID funding has been beneficial for orgs.
 - o PPE, SIA, Ester Funds have been beneficial.
 - o Charter school cash balances have increased.
 - o Some charter school students counts have gone down; Ivy student count has gone up in the last two years.

Treasurer report

- Income
 - o First month of getting a full month of state school funds 235K
 - o Still below budget because we are still approx. 20 students low
 - o Energy trust rebate
 - o Insurance settlement on tree work
- Expense
 - o Staffing over budget with higher assistant costs
 - o Physical Ed position is unfilled at the moment which off sets
- 161K below budget currently due primarily to low enrollment
- 758K Cash on hand
- Looking ahead to February we anticipate higher enrollment with vaccinations

Leadership Report

- Ivy is continually building student base and waiting list
- This year down 20 students but we are working towards financial stability and looking to onboard new students
- Onboarded new students this month
- Higher needs with students coming back around social agreement- balancing financial stability and keeping numbers down to support students around social agreements
- January we will be looking to see if there is room for more students
- The lowest we can go is what we budgeted for - 300 students
- Comfortably we can fit 320 students in the building

- Parent teacher conferences
 - 95% family participation. Teachers are reaching out to the other 5%. Goal is 100%
- Intervention specialist, Brooke, new position. SIA and Esore funding. Learning loss specialist for 1st grade to 8th grade students.
 - Higher needs this year: students and behavior challenges. Stress for families and teachers. Teachers dealing with more than they ever had to deal with before
 - Health and safety
 - Education
 - Getting students up to where they should be after they were out of school
- Admin staff has 2 assistant floaters to support staffing capacity.
- Special supports for the staff include - cooking breakfast for staff and/or providing lunch twice a week.
- Music teacher Aaron Nigel Smith nominated for a Grammy! All One Tribe. Interviewed at the school.
- Youth advocate- new position this year- she (Jenea) and Aaron Nigel Smith took students off site to work on the Aaron Nigel Smith album.
- Student council- voting in January. First year to have student council at Ivy.
- Working with global majority students around affinity groups
- Middle school is brand new.
 - Students get to switch classes.
 - 6th graders get to participate in math and science separate from own classroom.
- Climate survey for staff and board – history of this but opportunity for improvement in climate surveys.
- Admin has Mar 11 weekend retreat – request for BOD to have their retreat before that.

PTA Update (Sam)

- \$6800 of winter greenery. We get 33%
- Website is going well
- PTA meeting voted to have \$300 for snack program.
- Bread donation will be going to the teachers
- February will be the big fundraiser- will need more volunteers for the fundraiser.
