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Information pack for young people

We go on residential with our whole core company every Summer, currently for 5 days. It's a moment for them to connect, have a break from everyday life and create lots and lots of material that we bring home to explore in our regular sessions throughout the rest of the year.

Here are two templates of an information pack for residential:

- 2. A slightly shorter version of the information pack for the young people

We share this information with parents/guardians and our members as early as possible, approximately 3 months before we leave. We share this information with both adults and young people on Whatsapp and mention it to young people in sessions too.

Residential information pack - parents/guardians

Dear Parents,

Thank you all for responding to my messages about Residential attendance. I am glad to confirm that we have a venue for this year's trip which will take place from [insert dates].

Medication:

All staff are first aid trained.

All individual medications will be labelled, and handed to [staff member name] during drop off, with instructions from parents. This included any pain medication like paracetamol, travel sickness medication or hay fever medication. This information must also be included in the form you will need to fill in for this trip.

Any members with medication or conditions we need to know about will have a scheduled phone appointment with [staff name] to discuss what we need to know to best support your child.

We cannot administer any medication except an allergy pen, but we will supervise your child while they take theirs.

We cannot hand out painkillers or paracetamol.

Emergencies:

Should anything serious happen we will notify parents/guardians immediately and take your child to seek medical help at the local hospital. If you need to come home due to illness or injury, then a staff member will return by train with them.

Homesick:

Part of going away on residential is about building resilience and confidence – and seeing the week through to the end. Young people are rarely homesick or unhappy at Company Three residentials, but if they are we are very experienced in supporting them. If your child feels unhappy for any reason, we will:

- Do our best to understand and reassure them.
- Contact parents to discuss we ask that as much as possible parents support us in helping the child stay on residential.
- If the situation is serious, we have processes to ensure a young person is safely accompanied home

Mobile Phones:

Members are welcome to bring their phones with them, but we ask that they are kept in their rooms or given to a staff member to lock away during sessions. All staff will have work phones on them so you

can reach us in an emergency and a list with all core staff numbers will be sent out to all parents. Members will be able to call home during their free time.
