


Name_it: Singing Sound La-La Sound Tongue Lifter

<u>Tips:</u> Try this sound in the mirror. Remind your child to lift the tongue up to the bumpy spot behind his/her front top teeth.



L-Blend Parent Script




Today we're going to practice our singing sound in some words. The singing sound is the sound you use for la-la-la. Let me hear you practice your singing sound. You need to lift your tongue up to the bumpy spot. That sound is a tongue lifter! We move our tongue up while we say it. Can you say just this sound by itself? ///. Not "la" this time. Just say ///.


Now, let's put two sounds together like they are buddies! Can you say these sounds together? B-L. Nice work! I like how your tongue went up when you said the singing sound. Now let's say it in a word. Say, "blue".

Watch me and say these two sounds together. P-L. That's it! Watch my mouth and say it at the same time as me. P-L. Now let's say it in a word. Say, "play".


This time let's say G-L. That one is tricky because G is in the back of your mouth. Try it again. G-L. Now say, "glue". Now let's try another back sound, K-L. Now say, "clean".


