Throughout the year, a variety of assessments will be administered based on close readings of the required novels and textbook. Please provide hard copies (not digital) of the required course novels. If you are not prepared to read, then you should not take this course. We will read and write all year.

REQUIRED SUMMER TEXTS:

- *How to Read Literature Like a Professor* (revised edition) by Thomas C. Foster (ISBN: 978-0-06-230167-3)
- *All the Light We Cannot See* by Anthony Doerr (ISBN: 978-1-5011-7321-9)

TASKS:

1. Read and annotate the following chapters from *How To Read Literature Like A Professor* (*HTRLLAP*): 1, 2, 5, 6, 9, 11, 12, 14, 18, 19, 20 and 22.
2. Read and annotate *All The Light We Cannot See* (*ATLWCS*).
As you read the novel, pay attention to examples of concepts from *HTRLLAP*.
3. Join Google Classroom for AP Literature 2019-2020. **Code: jo28yas.**
4. Complete connection chart in Google Classroom. (See example below.)

Directions: Pick **any 8 of the above chosen chapters of *HTRLLAP*** to connect to the novel. In the first column, give key concepts from the 8 chosen chapters in *HTRLLAP*.
