Note: The following statements are intended to help shape your position on the use of AI in the classroom. While none of the items below have been voted on by the Generative AI Committee, they have been used by various faculty members in their course syllabi.

Business and Technology (Professor Andrea Francis, Accounting)

Artificial Intelligence-generated Content: Academic dishonesty includes the unauthorized use of AI-generated content on assignments or examinations unless an instructor for a given course specifically authorizes their use. Some instructors may approve of using generative AI tools in academic settings for specific purposes. However, these tools should be used only with the explicit and clear permission of each instructor, and then only in the ways allowed by the instructor. The use of AI-generated content for assignments and homework is prohibited in BTA 202 unless otherwise discussed by the instructor.
