Key Takeaways

- SUNY EOP
 - 55 SUNY schools offer EOP
 - All four-year colleges offer EOP.
 - Most community colleges offer EOP except (Clinton, Columbia-Greene, Herkimer County, Jamestown, North Country, and Sullivan County)

Foster Youth College Success Initiative (FYCSI)

- The Foster Youth College Success Initiative (FYCSI) is a state-funded program that connects youth in care, eligible orphans or wards of the court who are accepted into SUNY's Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) with additional academic support services. Critical financial assistance is also provided to help students enroll in, pay for and successfully complete college.
- Benefits: In addition to the comprehensive support services provided through participation in EOP, eligible foster youth receive an award each academic year to help pay for expenses above and beyond tuition. FYCSI funding can be used for: tuition and fees, housing, meals, books and supplies, transportation and personal expenses.

Graduate Opportunity Program (GOP)

 Program provides partial tuition assistance to EOP, HEOP, and SEEK program graduates undertaking graduate study at a participating SUNY institution.

Pre-Medical Opportunity Program

 Supplemental tutoring for gateway classes (organic chemistry, physics, biochemistry, calculus), clinical and laboratory experience, mentorship (physicians and medical school faculty), workshop/seminar series, virtual MCAT preparation workshops and study groups, summer program, including residency, modest financial assistance, system-wide EOP community of pre-medical scholars.

SUNY Smart Track

 Smart Track resources cover the spectrum of personal financial literacy, from budgeting, responsible credit card use and avoiding identity theft to the basics of banking, borrowing and working through college.
