Professional Learning Communities

The Adirondack Teacher Center is offering professional development in the area of Professional Learning Communities, providing teachers with structured time for reflection on classroom practices. The program enables teachers to take responsibility for identifying and satisfying needs for professional growth and addressing the needs of professionals to ensure that Every Student Succeeds.

To be considered for funding, Proposals should:

- Advance the study of and reflection upon the focus areas of the ATC, (Meeting the needs of diverse learners, NYS K-12 Computer Science and Digital Fluency Learning Standards, and safe, secure, other NYS learning standards, supportive, and inclusive learning environments, strategies to engage and include parents, family, and community members as active partners in children's education)
- Promote effective teaching strategies, advancement of curriculum rigor through teacher made materials, and the development of teacher/parent resources and workshops

A complete and thorough method of evaluation (data) for the project must be included and must be returned with other documentation to the Teacher Center at the completion of the project. The facilitator will have additional information. Lack of documentation may result in future projects being denied

Each group must have a **minimum of four** educators and a **maximum of ten** educators who will identify a common area of interest to study. **Groups must meet for 10 hours** during the Project Support period. Members are eligible for a \$350 stipend if all 10 hours have been completed. **Partial stipends will not be paid**. The ATC must be notified immediately if a participant decides not to complete the project. Facilitators will receive \$450 compensation. All virtual PLC's must have audio and video attendance. **Attendance forms and summaries must be submitted digitally to the ATC after each work session. Stipends may be paid only for work done outside of school hours, but a portion of the funding may be used to reimburse the district for substitute teacher costs.**

Funding is competitive and requires a formal proposal (attached). Priority will be given to **new** and **innovative** projects. Applications will be accepted, reviewed by the ATC Policy Board, and awarded on the basis of complete, detailed applications that meet the criteria as outlined above and on the application itself. A thorough and accurate budget must be completed.

The Adirondack Teacher Center will be awarding 4 Professional Learning Community Project Supports for the 2024-2025 school year which starts July 1. It is possible that more projects may be funded as the year progresses. All Project Support applications will be reviewed and awarded by the Policy Board. No applications will be reviewed from June 17th until September 25th, 2025. Award winners will be notified by email with an official hard copy letter to follow. All requirements of the project must be submitted by May 17, 2025. Any questions should be directed to:
