Ex. I	was sleeping at 10 last night. We were dining out last week, on Thursday evening

-	You (eat) lunch when the phone rang.
-	I (take) shower when you came
-	He (work) at 5, yesterday.
-	I (leave) when they called me.
PAST	<u> PERFECT SIMPLE –Had 3rd form</u>
Ex. S	he had left already when I looked for her. By the time he came, we had finished the
work.	
-	I (close) the shop when the customers came.
-	She (do shopping) when I found the list.
-	It (rain) before I left.
-	You (train) athletes when you became a trainer.
-	They (build) a house before they moved in.
PAST	T PERFECT CONTINUOUS- Had been Ving
Ex. S	he had been trying to open the door before I arrived. They had been working till 10
when	they stopped.
-	He (dig) in the garden before the rain started.
-	They (fix) the pipe before the water came.
-	I (read) a lot before I started writing.
-	She (work) without breaks before she left.
-	The cat (sleep) the whole evening before I put it out.
FUT	URE TENSE
FUT	URE SIMPLE – Will verb, going to, be to, Present Continuous, Present Simple
Ex. I	will call you. The tree is going to fall. We are leaving tomorrow. The train leaves at 8.
-	She (buy) a new car
-	I (read) this book.
-	The children (go) to school next week.
-	My neighbor (go) to work at 5 tomorrow morning.
-	They (fill) in these forms next week.
<u>FUT</u>	URE CONTINUOUS – will be Ving
Ex. M	fary will be flying to Paris at this time tomorrow. They will be building a highway next
May.	
-	I (eat out) at noon, next week.
-	You (lie) on the beach this time, tomorrow.
-	They (work) at noon, tomorrow.
-	You (work) in Spain next month.
-	It (snow) this time, in December.

FUTURE PERFECT – Will have 3rd form of verb

Ex.	They will have finished the work until tomorrow. She will have graduated until July.
-	He (finish) this work by this time tomorrow.
-	The plane (arrive) until 3 o'clock.
-	They (have) lunch until 2 o'clock.
-	We (go) till the afternoon.
-	They (buy) the materials until they start building.
