Chapter 1

Statement of Problem:

- According to Henderson and Berla (1994), the most accurate predictor of the students' achievement in school is not the income or the social status, but the extent to which families are able to create a home environment that supports learning, communicates high and reasonable expectations for their children's achievement and becomes involved in their children's school.
- In, Malaysia parental involvement in children's education is still at the minimum level.
- According to Faridah, Naimah, Hamidah, & Habibah (2005), in Malaysia the reason why
 the students result are poor is because of their parents and families give less support
 towards their education, lack of supervision in students improvement, did not check the
 students' homework and let the work of helping the children's education to the older
 siblings.
- The parents think by sending their children to school and give money when needed is enough and they have fulfilled their responsibility (Kertas Kerja Kajian Sistem Pendidikan Kebangsaan, 2001)

Purpose of Study:

- To investigate the children's perception towards the level of parental involvement in their homework.
- To look into children's perceptions about their parents getting involved in their homework.

• To see whether there are significant differences between the excellent students' parental involvement and the weak students' parental involvement in their children's homework.
