

American College Test (ACT)

Description/Rationale/Benefit(s) to Students

The ACT is a college admissions exam consisting of multiple choice questions in English, math, reading and science. There is also an optional writing component. The ACT is used by some colleges to assist with admissions and scholarship decisions. The purpose of the ACT is to measure a student's readiness for college, providing colleges with one common data point that can be used to compare applicants.

Required? By whom?	Required by Ohio; Required by some colleges and universities for admission and/or scholarships; other schools are test-optional

	to the school to share information with ACT. It is recommended that this occur during the annual review in ninth grade or earlier that year. With permission, the school will request the accommodations for the state administration. If a student is taking the ACT prior to the state administration, then these steps should be followed. Once ACT has approved accommodations for a student, the student can continue to use those approved accommodations on ACT assessments through high school. If a student's IEP or 504 accommodations change, then a new request will need to be submitted. Please contact your child's Intervention Specialist for more information.
Results - Timing/Access	Students can access their scores 2 - 8 weeks after the test and will need a MyACT online account. More information about accessing scores is available here.
