Primary goals of Agents module expansion:

- Greater compliance with metadata standards used to describe persons, families, and corporate entities i.e. MARCXML authority and EAC-CPF.
- Facilitate better exchange with databases like LCNAF and SNAC that use these standards by being able to record the information about agents that they require.
- Provide for better contextualization of agents by providing more ways to apply controlled access headings or information about the agent and their relationships.

Note: even though this expansion adds considerably to the possibilities for recording information about agents and their relationships, the requirements to make a valid agent remain minimal: an agent type and one Name Form sub-record. (Requirement for Source/Rules has been relaxed to reflect different ways this information is being captured in the new schema.) Some sub-records have requirements to make the sub-record valid, but the sub-records themselves are not required.

What's new or improved

Many changes to the Agent record form/schema

(note: there are tooltips for these sub-records and new fields if you mouse over them; user manual documentation will be coming in the process of finishing up the release)

An Agent record form is now divided into five sections (still all on one page). Each contains a set of sub-records. The sections are not sub-records themselves.


Basic Information

Basic Information: this section is used to indicate the agent type and whether the agent is published or not.



Record Control Information: this section contains information about the record itself, with the expectation that it originated outside of ArchivesSpace or is going to be shared with a system other than ArchivesSpace.

Identity Information: this section is the core information about the agent him/her/themselves. Name Form is the only required sub-record in an Agent record.



Dates of Existence

- New structure to provide for standardized dates and begin/end dates of expression
- Please note that because of numerous requests, Dates of Existence is now added to the display name for the agent if there is no entry in the Dates field for the name form indicated to be the Display Name. If this is not desired for an individual agent, uncheck Automatically generate for the Sort Name for that agent.



Description Information: this section provides for further descriptive information about the agent, including controlled access terms that describe the agent.



New sub-records:

- Gender this is a configurable value list; ArchivesSpace will ship with no values but an indication of some possible externally derived controlled vocabularies
- Places geographic subject terms related to the agent such as place of birth, residence
- Occupations occupation subject terms related to the agent
- Functions function subject terms related to the agent
- Topics topical subject terms related to the agent
- Languages controlled value languages and notes related to languages used by or associated with the agent

Contact Details

• Contact notes now a full repeatable sub-record with fields for Persistent ID, Date of Contact (text, not date), and Contact Notes to give more structure



Larsen, Nella, 1891-1964

Biography

Nella Larsen, Harlem Renaissance writer, librarian and nurse

New Lasen, namen remeassance with, audreain and in tase.

She was born in Chicago in 1893 to a white Danish mother and a black West Indian father. Two years later, after her father died, her mother married a Dane. Educated in Chicago, at sixteen Larsen travelled to Denmark and remained for three years. After a year of study at Fisk University, she attented the University of Copenhagen, and later returned to the United States where she graduated from the Lincoln Hospital Training Program in New York (1915). Larsen married Elmer S. Imes, an African American physicist in 1919, and became associated with the cultural awakening in Hartem, known as the Harlem Renaissance. From 1921-1926 she worked as a children's librarian at the 135 Street Branch of the New York Public Library.

Larsen's first short story was published in 1926, and her two novels quickly followed: "Quicksand" (1928) and "Passing" (1929). The following year she became the first African American woman to win a Guggenheim award for creative writing. Her books are autobiographical in nature, dealing with identity and marginality and explore the consciousness and psychology of female character. An unsubstantiated charge of plagiarism and her divorce in 1933 ended Larsen's career as one of the Harfem Renaissance's major novelists. Her nursing career began in 1941 and she worked as a nurse in several hospitals in Brooklyn and Manhattan. Larsen died in relative obscurity in 1964. Agents "Light" mode

Light mode gives system administrators and users the flexibility to see a streamlined view of Agent records.


- Full mode displays all Agent sub-records; Light is a smaller subset of sub-records. It is mainly
 what was in an agent record prior to the expansion of the module, but includes some
 sub-records that have been frequently requested like Entity IDs.
- The "add and edit extended agent attributes" permission determines whether Full mode is available to a permission group (and thus a user in the permission group). All admin users have this permission.



Aside from Contact Details, all data in an Agent record is viewable in View mode, regardless of permissions.

Users with permission to work with agents in Full mode can use the toggle on the toolbar to turn Light mode on and off.

• The setting is sticky - the view will stay in Full mode until the toggle unless/until the Light mode toggle is checked. At that point the view will stay in Light mode until it is unchecked.

If a user who does not have Full mode privileges opens a record in Edit mode that has information in Full-only sub-records, they see a warning
