1. Check in. Comments about the good quality of Bridging.
2. Bank balance is \$5,147.73 of which \$872.12 is for *Read to Me, Father* and \$131.00 is for R E scholarships.

6. Green Sanctuary plans
 - a. There will be a church meeting Sunday, Oct. 13 after morning worship to discuss suggested purchases and other needs for the church building. Thanks to Ginger Irish and Janet Dye for their research and footwork on the appliance purchase.
 - b. Debbie received permission from the Parish Committee to initiate contact with Interfaith Power and Light (IP&L) re: a weatherization program for houses of worship, offered by MassSave, which may provide free insulation and weatherization through one of their contractors. Debbie has contacted IP&L, naming herself and Bob Messing as contacts for the

church. She received a response and is now waiting for contact from the contractor to begin the process.

c. Following 10+ years as Chair, Debbie is relinquishing the responsibilities of overseeing the Green Team. She will remain an active member of the group. A new chair has not been determined.

7. Peace Committee projects

a. The Bridgewater International Cities for Peace held a successful Fourth Annual Bridgewater Peace Week Sept. 22 – 28 with many events around town.

b. The opening ceremony was at the FP Peace Pole prior to the morning worship on Sep. 22. The Southeastern Massachusetts Social Justice Choir again sang. Lisa Rue, Lisa Troy, Jim Quinn, Vernon Domingo and Jack Hart all participated. Debbie Baumgarten planted flowers around the base of the pole.

c. A very special Worship Service followed in the sanctuary with all the same participants, plus Pat Hart as Lay Leader and Denise Haskins as chief musician. Many thanks especially to Lisa Troy for her moving presentation of the Sadako story. Also, kudos to Alan Yabroud for a plethora of slides and other tech support.

Janet said there were about 20 people at the peace pole at the library. Weather didn't cooperate for the BCCR standout for peace.

8. Welcoming Congregation Committee plans

a. Laurie will try to recruit people to work on the WCC at church on Sunday while working to get more people involved on all the church committees.
