New Business

2022-2023 Audit Presentation

Ally from Yeo and Yeo stated that the school was given an Unmodified Opinion on the 2022-2023 School Audit. Ally reported that we generated about 1.9 million in federal revenue for the year. There are two reasons for that. One was ESSER funds that were received. The revenues exceeded the expenditures. This year for the physical year of 2024 Ally believes that the district's fund balance will come in higher than the state average. Ally shared with the board that when it comes to general financing, she believes that making the move to the MAISD will be good for the district. The district will have more resources, support, and timely data. Ally also talked about technology and that they now audit personnel that leave the district and how the district makes sure that those former employees are deleted from all technology.

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Approve Amended 2023-2024 General Fund Budget

The Finance committee met today before the board meeting. Hubbard reported we are down about 65 students at the Wyoming Center. That is not totally unexpected. Hubbard stated that they have been focused on the CSI for the program. With that, we will be dipping into our fund balance by \$360,000. The district has put in a lot of updates in the last couple of years. The boilers have been updated. We have added the HVAC system to the building. We are going to pause on the Wyoming project. This might be only until the summer. The district will still update the security portion of the update.

Hubbard reported that the food service is over budget right now. We will need to spend about \$15,000.
