- Ariadna will be speaking about the upcoming changes on Europeana's licensing policy for user-generated content. They published a blogpost [here](#) and they are seeking feedback. Ariadna will explain
 - User generated content: invite users to tell their story
 - How to translate some of these technical questions into copyright questions?
 - Little pieces of information shared by any user -- geographical reference, tags, etc.
 - Europeana has a lot of projects that have user-generated content

- They are searching for having a more standardized / harmonized approach
- Examples of projects they have done with user-generated content:

- The information that they get from users, enriches the content that is being then posted into Europeana
- On a tab, they say that the information was provided by an user: https://www.europeana.eu/en/item/2020601/https_1914_1918_europeana_eu_contributions_12667
- Big questions:
 - (two more questions I missed)
 - What license do they apply to these contributions?
 - How much do they inform about who provided this information? How much information they provide to users about their policy? What do they tell users about the provenance of the information? What do cultural heritage institutions feel about data enrichment?
- Policy:
 - Can Europeana enrich anything they want? They've answered this question as a "yes". But there are differences: if it's a transcription, then it gets into a more grey area // if it's just a statement of "this garment is red", then it's easier.
 - They are making a bet to make it easier for future uses -- so only accepting to enrich content that has a permissive license (CC BY, CC BY-SA, CC0 or Public Domain Mark)
 - The licenses that they will put to the user-generated content, they are asking users not to apply any additional restriction

- [Eleanor Kenny](#) - Europeana. Call to action & invitation to participate in the [European Commission consultation on digital cultural heritage](#). **You can get in touch with Eleanor at eleanor.kenny@europeana.eu**
 - *Notes:* there were some consultations nearly a decade ago; the sector has moved as well; the EC Consultation has been super important to advance the mission of Europeana; at the European level they are making decisions that will affect funding. The results of the consultation will inform the funding, the EC pay attention to the answers of these survey. If they don't hear a strong voice from the sector, this will impact on the work of Europeana.
 - Some important aspects that Europeana will include: re-use; importance of linked/interoperable data; intangible cultural heritage, the approach to digitization needs to be inclusive and holistic; capacity building it's huge for Europeana (that is also in the [Strategy of Europeana](#)); there's a need of capacity building across the sector; focus on copyright; ethical use of AI. This is nowhere near the final version, **but these are the points that Europeana feels that are important for the consultation.**
 - Plead: the voice of everyone really counts here. The Commission needs to know what the sector thinks and what the priorities are for the sector. This will impact the future of the sector.

- Medhavi will talk about Gif It Up! India and her new podcast “[Embrace Digital](#)”. **You can get in touch with Medhavi at: medhavi@theheritagelab.in**
 - *Notes:* she started a project called The Heritage Lab with the intention to bring local knowledge for Indian heritage. Her website is starting to be a repository. Bridge the gap between the museums and people and collaborate with international organizations, to let Indian museums be part of the global conversation.
 - Museums weren't openly sharing their heritage, and this has been a struggle. A way to spark the conversation was to bring the GIF It Up! contest/campaign. Now there are a lot of museums willing to listen because of COVID.
 - The DAG Museum was very eager to start the campaign, and The Heritage Lab had to do a lot of myth busting around some fundamental questions. They got a great response, through what people shared, but also through social media engagement. Now they have more museums wanting to engage with the initiative for the October/November edition of GIF It Europeana!
 - Social media is super important for Indian museums. It's a super acceptable metric for Indian museums, not so much as other platforms such as Wikimedia Commons.
 - There's a lot of scaling / level up to be made in the sector.
 - Practical advice: even sharing some tools like spreadsheets, checklists, are useful for museums.
 - Majd: fostering more conversations South-South. How we can do it?
 - Medhavi: Possible collaborations? Small festivals?
 - Majd: spin-off conversations for South-South around the struggles that GLAM have in this part of the world?

Define a policy for what we are expecting:

- We will curate a list of invitees that have a history of contributing to the conversation of #OpenGLAM on Twitter, or who represent parts of the #OpenGLAM conversation not well highlighted in the Global community.
 - We want the roster to be inclusive, so account for balance in gender, geographies and cultures
 - Folks can participate in the languages they are comfortable in.
- We will invite them to curate the account for 1-2 weeks each via Tweetdeck, --how much time do we think this will take them? (30 minutes to two hours per a day, and contribute for at least 5 days during that window of time).

Participation will look like:

- Start with an introduction to who the person is and what they do -- including an update to the description of the @openglam account and an image change for that account to reflect the current curator.
- subsequent days try to highlight or explain OpenGLAM activities from their part of the larger community/context. Some things you might include:
 - highlighting work at your institution or work that you're doing with institutions.
 - highlighting what you are reading or find interesting in openglam, lodlam, or glam practice more generally.
 - Sharing digital objects that inspire you, get you thinking, or help you better understand what it means to work in "open" or in "GLAM" spaces -- these don't need to be new content, it could be historical.
 - Starting creative conversations about gaps, biases, and blind spots of existing communities, projects and activities in the GLAM space.
- What the account shouldn't be doing:
 - highlighting conversations, topics or issues without highlighting their connection to the #openglam practice space -- remember the audience for this twitter account is following to learn more about how you do OpenGLAM work, and to connect with a larger conversation. For example, you may not want to talk about the international conflicts or public

- discussions about race, unless you tie them back to how openglam and how it ensures that the public is informed about the historical context of those issues or highlight specific projects that intervene in these political issues well.
 - Promoting commercial projects or enterprises, even if they are working on the OpenGLAM arena
 - If you are unsure or have doubts about some content that you want to post on the account, ask the support group (Sander, Alex, Scann) if it's appropriate or not.
