Photo 1: Composition Assignment

We looked at many varieties of composition! You will need to shoot the following frames based around a specified theme (remember that objects are lame). Please be ready to verbally defend your choice.

You will need to write down the exposure settings for each image: f-stop and shutter speed. Draw in the box a simplified version of your shot.

1.	<u>Simplicity:</u> Shoot two frames representing your chosen theme using the same image. Shoot one with a busy background and the other with a simple background. Important! Don't let your subject move- YOU move OR change
	aperture to 'blur' the background.
2.	Rule of Thirds: Shoot 3 frames in which you put the same subject in three
	different spots in your viewfinder- the center, and two of the four possible
	'rule of thirds' intersections.
3.	<u>Framing:</u> Shoot two images that have the subject nicely framed by a foreground or background element.
4.	<u>Leading Lines:</u> Shoot 2 frames that use real or implied lines to draw the viewer's interest toward the focal point of the photo.
5.	<u>Balance:</u> Shoot one frame that demonstrates formal balance and 1 that is informally balanced.
