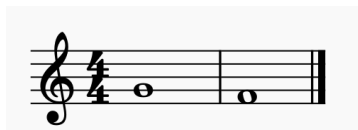

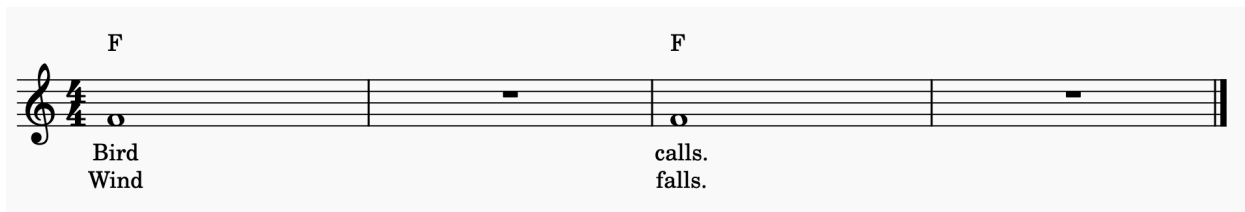

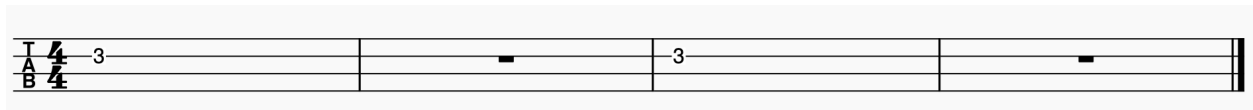

Getting started

- First, let's sing the song together slowly so everyone can learn the words.
- While we sing, some of you can play a **steady F note** as a **drone** — that means holding the same sound to make a background tone while others sing.
- If you play **guitar, ukulele, or keyboard**, you can strum or play the **F chord** to keep the harmony steady.
- At the end, let's all say the last line in a **whisper voice**, like the train is fading far away down the tracks.
