Form A: Notification of Truancy (Letter 1)

Information that Pertains to UNEXCUSED Absences:

Attendance Law:

California law (Education Code 48260) classifies a student as "a truant" when the student has missed school on three occasions involving any combination of the following:

- Being absent from school without a valid excuse for a full day; and/or,
- Being more than 30 minutes late to a period during the schoolday; and/or,
- Being absent from school without a valid excuse for more than 30 minutes.

Legal Consequences:

We are required to notify you of the following information related to your student's unexcused absences, as stated in Education Code 48260.5. This law reads as follows:

Upon a pupil's initial classification as a truant, the school district shall notify the pupil's parent or guardian using the most cost-effective method possible, which may include electronic mail or a telephone call:

- a) That the pupil is truant.
- b) That the parent or guardian is obligated to compel the attendance of the pupil at school.
- c) That parents or guardians who fail to meet this obligation may be guilty of an infraction and subject to prosecution pursuant to Article 6 (commencing with Section 48290) of Chapter 2 of Part 27.
- d) That alternative educational programs are available in the district.
- e) That the parent or guardian has the right to meet with appropriate school personnel to discuss solutions to the pupil's truancy.
- f) That the pupil may be subject to prosecution under Section 48264.
- g) That it is recommended that the parent or guardian accompany the pupil to school and attend classes with the pupil for one day.
