

CUNY BACCALAUREATE FOR UNIQUE AND INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES

ATTEND AN INFO SESSION

WHAT IS CUNY BACCALAUREATE (CUNY BA)?

CUNY BA is an Interdisciplinary Studies bachelor's degree program that works within the CUNY system. It has been around for over fifty years! CUNY BA is for students who want to design a bachelor's degree (Area of Concentration| AOC) that is not already offered in CUNY (minimum 120 credits). As part of the CUNY BA application, students propose what they want to study and what CUNY courses they think are suitable for the bachelor's degree they are creating. CUNY BA students take courses in the CUNY departments and/or colleges to fulfill the AOC requirements. So, students will have to be enrolled in a CUNY college to be part of CUNY BA program (that will be the student's home college).

SOME OF THE BENEFITS OF CUNY BA:

Students can transfer up to 90 credits
Students can take courses in multiple CUNY departments and campuses
Students can start the program while at a CUNY community college


Hunter students who have read her memoir have prepared questions for her in advance and we are so looking forward to welcoming her back to Hunter College.

Ly Tran, Author of House of Sticks, Returns to Hunter College

Ly Tran grew up in New York City as a Vietnamese refugee. She persevered in school as a smart and disciplined student despite obligations at home and the fact that she very badly needed glasses to be able to see the board.

Ly entered Hunter's Macaulay Honors College, earning a 4.0 GPA in her first semester. However, life took a downward turn and she eventually dropped out. In the book she says she left "never to return again," but she came back in Fall 2023 to meet Hunter students reading her memoir, House of Sticks.

On Friday, Oct 3rd, she returns again and will answer questions crafted by Hunter students who have read her memoir this month. This visit is another opportunity for meaningful connection and dialogue about the immigrant experience, and the journey to find one's voice in writing.

Share Your Art: Hunter Underground


Submission Deadline September 26
