**“Mental Health First Aid” course**

We are increasingly confronted with crises in our everyday lives. Mental health problems and illnesses have a significant impact on the well-being of students as well.

By learning to recognize the signs of mental health issues and responding appropriately, we can positively influence the lives of those in need—as well as our own. In our “Mental Health First Aid” course, you will acquire essential knowledge about mental health and learn how to implement concrete support measures. This enables you to help others navigate crisis situations, facilitate access to professional care, and provide reassurance so that those affected do not feel alone.

This course, certified by the Australian initiative Mental Health First Aid International, teaches you to identify the early signs of mental illness. You will gain foundational knowledge of the most common and severe mental health conditions, including depression, anxiety disorders, psychoses, and addictive behaviors. You will also explore crisis intervention and prevention strategies. Through group exercises and role-playing, you will practice applying the support measures in real-life scenarios.

As a Mental Health First Aider, you will learn to apply the five-step R.O.G.E.R. principle:

React – Listen Openly – Give Support – Encourage Professional Help – Reactivate Resources.

This approach equips you to provide effective support, remain calm in acute situations, and take preventive action.

Participants will receive a certificate of attendance, and those who complete a brief assessment at the end of the seminar will be certified as Mental Health First Aiders.

All participants will also receive a Mental Health First Aid handbook as part of the course.
