[Facing History & Ourselves](#) is an international education organization headquartered in Boston, MA, whose mission is to use lessons of history to challenge teachers and their students to stand up to racism, antisemitism, and other forms of bigotry and hate. We work with educators as they challenge students to reflect on and analyze moral questions and dilemmas that arise during the study of history and literature. Our curriculum is used to guide students as they explore human behavior, asking them to consider connections between their own actions and the actions of others. By examining the complexities of being human, we foster caring and curious adolescents who grow into brave and engaged adults.

Internship Description:

Internships at Facing History & Ourselves are typically a mixture of core projects and administrative support. Interns are paired with direct supervisors and the intern is assigned projects based on the need of Facing History and the individual supervisor, and the Intern's interests. Across the board, learning opportunities are provided that expose participants to Facing History content and teaching approach.

The summer internship is managed through our Headquarters office in Boston, MA, and is typically remote, with interns reporting to teams across the US. We provide orientation, regular check-ins, an opportunity to connect with other Interns and Volunteers, participation in staff meetings and social events, exposure to our core work, access to our resources, networking sessions with staff, access to our Employee Resource Groups, and time with our President and CEO. At the end of the summer, we have a small gathering to present on the projects completed over the summer. The selected intern will work with one (or more) teams.

We expect the intern to follow a consistent schedule, work 2-5 days per week between 9am and 5pm, work diligently, and ask questions and request new projects when appropriate. Professional etiquette is expected. You will be asked to read and abide by our Anti-Harassment and Youth Protection Policies as well as our Data Security Policy, Acceptable Use & Written Information Security Policies. All internships are remote unless other arrangements are made. Interns are gifted with a Facing History resource of their choice and may be loaned a computer for use during the internship.

Past projects have included:

- Researching articles (scholarly, opinion pieces, etc.) around equity in education and labeling/identifying themes that we would then add to a sort of "scholarship library" for FH staff.
- Updating our Intranet
- Current Research in Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion
- Research the process for becoming an approved provider of PD for teachers and school leaders in all 50 states
- Online Seminar and Webinar management and support
- Updating data on schools and educators
- Compiling evaluations and extracting key quotes
