# Free school meals and assistance with clothing

Since the Scottish Government have started providing free school meals for nursery-P5, many parents are not applying for the free school meals/clothing grant. Please ensure that you do this if you are entitled. The cost of living has increased and if you are entitled to this support then it will help with the cost of school uniforms, school shoes, jackets, etc.


It is also important for the school that you apply if you are entitled, the % of children entitled to the clothing grant, plays an important factor in allocation of resources, such as number of hours of pupil support assistants we receive, our allocation of Pupil Equity Funding. If you are successful in receiving the grant, this is done in confidence and children are never identified in school.

#### Golden Break

We have introduced a golden break on a Friday morning. In school and the playground we use a card system called STOP.THINK.CHANGE. When children are not making good choices about their behaviour, an adult will give them a verbal warning (sometimes 2 warnings) to encourage the child to change their behaviour. If they continue then the child will be given a small card. When a child is given a card, they will lose their 10 minutes golden break. During the golden break, some teachers will be outside with the children and other teachers will stay in with children to help them complete a reflective, restorative activity. This is to encourage children to think about their behaviour and to think about how they can change it in the future. After the 10 minutes golden break, all children will then go out for their normal playtime and spend this with their friends. All reflective exercises will come to my office and I will monitor these. If your child continues to receive these then the class teacher will be in touch to invite you in for a meeting to support around this.



# **County Sports - Wednesday 12th June**

We have signed up to take part in the County Sports, this will involve children in P5, P6 and P7. Ms Webster will be working with teachers to select children to take part. Once we have selected the teams, permission slips will be issued. We may be looking for some parents to help train the children for the events.



# Baillie Cup - Wednesday 5th June

We have also signed up to the Baillie Cup again this year. This is for children in P1-P4. Mrs Ross will be working with teachers to select children to take part in the event. As above, once teams have been selected we will communicate with parents.



#### **Cross Country event**

On Saturday 20th April Zara, Austin and Alex (and their parents), travelled down to Kirkcaldy to take part in a Cross Country event. The children did very well and enjoyed representing the school. Austin and Alex both placed in the top 10, in races that had around 80plus runners.

It would be great if we could aim to have a Cross Country lunchtime or afterschool club in place early in the next school session. To do this we would need some parent volunteers to run this club and our new Active Schools Coordinator, Murdoch Jamieson, would be keen to help support getting the club established.
