On your registration Google form, you will find the following sections/selections:

**CAREER PATHWAYS/COMPLETER PROGRAM**: Be certain to choose a Career Pathway and Completer Program. Career pathways give students the opportunity to select a career field of interest to explore while they are still in high school. Because each of the six pathways are broadly defined there are overlapping courses within pathways. See pages 6-12 in the high school planning guide. Completer Programs are a series of courses in a specialized area that help you prepare for further study and/or a career.

**ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS:** If you have taken (and passed) the courses recommended by your counselor over the past three years, you should have only English as a specific requirement senior year. If you have failed any of your graduation requirements in previous years, be certain you have retaken them or register for them now in the registration form. **Please note that you are required to take a math class senior year.** 

**ELECTIVES/OTHER COURSE OFFERINGS:** Select these from the course offerings list. If you are taking an additional year of a class you have already taken (theater or team sports, for example) be certain you use the course number appropriate to the level of the program. (for example, if you have already taken band 1 and 2, be certain to use the registration number for band 3 this year.)

**ALTERNATES:** You must select two additional classes that you have not selected in other sections of the registration form in case you do not get the electives you have chosen.

VIS (Virtual in School) is an optional way for high school students to learn. Students will be assigned a block during the school day to report to a classroom. A staff mentor will monitor attendance and support students with technology needs or proctoring exams. Each student can work at their own pace, with 24/7 access to an online course (within designated start and end dates). Students must be organized, persistent, goal-oriented, self-motivated, and enjoy taking responsibility for their own learning. Students in the program should be comfortable with advocating for themselves by reaching out to the teacher for support when needed.

**WORK BASED LEARNING:** Remember that you may *not* sign up directly for Student Service Learning, Mentor/Internships, or an Apprenticeship. You must choose 8 classes, check off the program you are interested in on the registration form. You will be contacted regarding next steps and the application process.

**DUAL ENROLLMENT**: Remember you may not sign up directly for dual enrollment. If you are interested in taking college courses at FCC, Hood College or any other college please check the open campus box. If you are interested in taking FCC courses at OHS, please check the high school-based box.
