





### SKETCHES OF PITT COUNTY



TYSON, GENERAL LAW-RENCE DAVIS, was born on the old Tyson homestead on the north side of Contentnea Creek. about ten miles west of Greenville and three miles east of Farmville, July 4th, 1861. His father, Richard Lawrence Tyson, a planter and merchant, and his grandfather, Sherrod Tyson, also a large planter and extensive land-owner, were born on the same farm. His father was a Confederate soldier, enlisting April 4th, 1862, in Company K, Seventeenth North Carolina Regiment. He was a non-commissioned officer; 3d Sergeant of his company. His great-grandfather was a soldier of the Revolution. His father died at Raleigh, N. C.,

June 30th, 1879. His mother, Mrs. Margaret Louise Tyson, born September 20th, 1840, is a daughter of the late Moses and Martha (Briley) Turnage. Her father was a large planter and in the war of 1812-15, was a Corporal in Captain Samuel Vines' Company. Her grandfather, Benjamin Briley, was a private in the same Company.

His father was very desirous that his son should have the best educational advantages, but the impossibility of securing good teachers so soon after the civil was, led him to move to Greenville about 1873, where there were some better schools. Afterwards his father moved to the western part of the state and in the Summer of 1879 Lawrence secured an appointment as Cadet to the United States Military Academy, at West Point, New York, having won the appointment in competition with eleven others. He became a Cadet at the Academy July 1st, 1879, and four years later, June 1st, 1883, was graduated and appointed a Second Lieutenant in the 9th United States Infantry and sent west. He was in the frontier service in Kansas, Wyoming, Arizona and New Mexico and was in two active campaigns against hostile indians before being transferred to New York in 1887. He was again transferred, to Arizona in 1889.

In 1890 he was appointed Professor of Military Science and Tactics at the University of Tennessee, at Knoxville. While discharging this

#### **Short Bio**

Lawrence Davis Tyson (1861–1929), father of McGhee Tyson, was an American military officer, politician, and businessman from North Carolina who rose to prominence in Tennessee. A West Point graduate, he served in the Spanish–American War and later as a brigadier general in World War I, commanding the 59th Brigade of the 30th Infantry Division in France. His unit was instrumental in breaching the Hindenburg Line, a decisive Allied victory, and he received the U.S. Distinguished Service Medal, along with Britain's Companion of the Order of the Bath and Distinguished Service Order. After the war, Tyson became a successful textile manufacturer in Knoxville and entered politics, winning election as a Democratic U.S. senator in 1925. He is remembered as a decorated soldier-statesman whose leadership shaped both America's military success abroad and Tennessee's civic and economic growth.

## Long Bio

Lawrence Davis Tyson (1861–1929) was an American military officer, businessman, and politician whose career bridged war, industry, and public service. Born in Greenville, North Carolina, he graduated from West Point in 1883 and began a steady rise through the Army. He first gained field command during the Spanish–American War, leading the 6th U.S. Volunteer Infantry in Puerto Rico. His most notable service came in World War I, when he was promoted to brigadier general and placed in command of the 59th Brigade of the 30th Infantry Division in France. Under his leadership, the brigade played a crucial role in breaching the heavily fortified Hindenburg Line in September 1918, a breakthrough that helped hasten the war's end. For his leadership, Tyson received the Distinguished Service Medal from the United States, while Britain honored him with the Companion of the Order of the Bath and the Distinguished Service Order.

After the war, Tyson retired from active duty and settled in Knoxville, Tennessee, where he built a thriving textile business that contributed to the region's economic growth. Beyond industry, he was active in civic life and became a prominent figure in Tennessee politics. A loyal Democrat, he served in the Tennessee House of Representatives, rising to the position of Speaker, before winning election to the U.S. Senate in 1925. During his time in Washington, he championed veterans' causes, supported national defense measures, and advocated for economic development in his home state. Tyson remained in office until his death in 1929. Remembered as both a decorated general and a statesman, he left a lasting legacy of military distinction, civic leadership, and service to Tennessee and the nation.
