## Baba Mandir



Baba Harbhajan Singh Mandir, commonly known as Baba Mandir, is a revered shrine situated in the Indian state of Sikkim. Nestled in the Eastern Himalayas, this unique temple is dedicated to Baba Harbhajan Singh, a soldier in the Indian Army who is believed to possess divine powers even after his death. The mandir is located at an altitude of approximately 13,123 feet (4,000 meters) between Nathula and Jelepla Passes in East Sikkim, near the China border.

3. **Canteen and Souvenir Shop:** A small canteen serves refreshments to visitors, and a souvenir shop offers memorabilia related to Baba Harbhajan Singh and the Indian Army.

The Baba Mandir is not just a place of worship but also a symbol of faith and patriotism. Devotees come here to offer prayers, light candles, and incense sticks, and seek Baba's blessings. It is a common belief that writing a letter to Baba Harbhajan Singh and leaving it at the temple will have one's wishes fulfilled.

Soldiers stationed in the region treat Baba Harbhajan Singh as a member of their regiment. His portrait is kept in the barracks, and he is honored with an official rank and pay. A reserved seat is often found for him in military convoys, signifying his eternal presence and protection.
