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Abstract: *This template is a guide format for authors. Authors should follow the directions given in this guide. Introduction (ABADI, size 13)

Contains a description of the situation analysis or objective condition of the service subject (assisted community), issues and focus of service, reasons for choosing the service subject, and expected social change or community service goals supported by qualitative and quantitative data and supported literature reviews relevant. Include references according to the rules of writing. **APA (American Psychological Association) Style sixth edition.** (ABADI, size 12, Spacing: before 6 pt; after 6 pt, Line spacing: 1)

Method (ABADI, size 13)

Contains a description of the community action planning process (community organizing). In this case, it is explained who is the subject of the service, the place and location of the service, the involvement of the assisted subject in the community planning and organizing process, the research method or strategy used to achieve the expected goals and the stages of community service activities. The planning process and strategies/methods use flowcharts or diagrams. (ABADI, size 12, Spacing: before 6 pt; after 6 pt, Line spacing: 1)

Result and Discission (ABADI, size 13)

Result (ABADI, size 12)

Contains a description of the results of the community service process, namely an explanation of the dynamics of the mentoring process (various activities carried out, forms of technical action or program action to solve community problems). It also explains the expected emergence of social change, for example, the emergence of new institutions, changes in behaviour, the emergence of local leaders, the creation of new awareness towards social transformation, and so on.

The interpretation of research results must be supported by adequate data and can be supplemented with tables, graphs (pictures) or charts. Paragraphs begin with words indented into six digits and may use organizing writing into "sub-heading children" for each variable. (ABADI, size 12, Spacing: before 6 pt; after 6 pt, Line spacing: 1)

Discussion (ABADI, size 12)

Contains a description of the discussion of community service results and theoretical discussions relevant to the findings of community service results. It also discusses the theoretical findings of the service process from the beginning until social change occurs. The discussion on the results of community service is strengthened by references and theoretical perspectives supported by relevant literature reviews.

Paragraphs begin with words indented into six digits and may use organizing writing into "sub-heading children" for each variable. References use writing rules **APA (American Psychological Association) Style sixth edition**. (ABADI, size 12, Spacing: before 6 pt; after 6 pt, Line spacing: 1)

Conclusion (ABADI, size 13)

It contains a summary description of the research results in the form of theoretical reflections and recommendations (if any). (ABADI, size 12, Spacing: before 6 pt; after 6 pt, Line spacing: 1)

Acknowledgements (ABADI, size 13)

It contains a description of gratitude or acknowledgement to parties (individuals or institutions) who have helped directly or indirectly in the success of community service program activities. (ABADI, size 12, Spacing: before 6 pt; after 6 pt, Line spacing: 1)

Daftar Referensi (ABADI, size 13)

The bibliography is written according to the **APA (American Psychological Association)**. Reference sources in the form of journals from related books or articles from official sources. To maintain consistency in referring, quoting and writing a bibliography, we recommend using standard reference applications such as Endnote or Mendeley.
