Directions: Answer the questions below.

“Right There” Questions: “Right There” questions are directly from the text. Words used in the question and the words used in the answer can usually be found in the same sentences.

1. What does a boy have to be holding before he can speak at a meeting?
2. Who says “We’ll have rules!” ... “Lots of rules! Then when anyone breaks ‘em”
3. A little boy with a mulberry scar steps forward to talk to Ralph and the assembly. What is his concern?

“Think and Search” Questions: The answers to these questions *are in the text*, but the words used in the questions and those used for the answers are not in the same sentence. You need to think about different parts of the text and how ideas can be put together before you can answer the questions.

1. How does Ralph handle the situation (not The Situation from Jersey Shore) with the boy and the beastie?
2. What happened when the boys tried to light the fire?

3. What are Piggy's suggestions for survival?

4. What happened to the boy with the mulberry scar?

“Author and You” Questions: The answers are *not* in the text. You need to think about what you know, what the author says, and how they fit together.

1. What does the conch stand for?

2. How well are the boys “following the rules” and working together?

“On Your Own”: The text got you thinking, but the answer is inside of your head. The author can't help you much. So think about it, and use what you know already about the question.

1. Which character would you be like if you were stuck on a stranded island?
