
# Witness by Karen Hesse

#### Act I:

- 1) Whose perspective is *Witness* told from? Explain.
- 2) Why does Merlin Van Tornhout say, "I pushed the window up in school to get the stink of Leonora Sutter out of the classroom"? Explain.



## Act II:

- 1) What happened to the "rich" boy in Chicago?
- 2) How does Mr. Field's story about the Civil War regiment affect Leonora? Explain.
- 3) Which groups of people do the Klan dislike? Are you surprised by this?

## Act III:

- 1) How does the Klan appear to serve the "best interest of the greater community"?
- 2) Percelle Johnson saves Viola Pettibone's cat? What does this reveal about the community's values?
- 3) Do you believe in capital punishment for minors? Explain.

#### Act IV and V:

- 1) How does Constable Johnson feel about having to protect the "200 negroes that have moved into the state to build the dam"? Explain.
- 2) Why is Reynard Alexander's perspective important to the story? Explain.
- 3) What does the "young buck" symbolize at the end of Witness? Explain.



II. In a well-written paragraph, please discuss the title of this book. Why do you think Karen Hesse entitled the novel *Witness*? Do you think it's a good title? Are the theme and central idea hidden in the title? (8 pts.)
