# Section 1: Introduction

### Greetings!

Thanks for your interest in the *Star Wars Trilogy Despecialized Edition*. As the author of this guide, allow me to emphasize that I'm simply a fellow Star Wars fan helping others discover this amazing project. Credit for its creation goes to **Harmy** along with countless others who have dedicated their time, skills, and resources toward this restoration. Getting copies of the *Despecialized Editions* ("DEED") can be a hurdle, so I'm here to help.

As with any fan edit, YOU MAY ONLY DOWNLOAD THIS PROJECT IF YOU ARE A LEGAL OWNER OF THE OFFICIAL SOURCE. For Harmy's DEED project, this means YOU MUST OWN AN OFFICIAL RELEASE IN HD (for 1080p) or 4K UHD (for 2160p) of each respective film (i.e., Star Wars Episodes IV, V, & VI). Examples include official Blu-ray Discs, 4K UltraHD discs, or a purchased digital release.

This Star Wars fan community is built on the honor system with the understanding that if people who don't own legal copies of the *Star Wars Original Trilogy* obtain the DEED, it's possible that the entire project will be shut down due to piracy allegations. So please encourage people to support the Star Wars franchise and purchase the official releases!

This guide is meant to introduce people to the DEED project, outline methods of obtaining copies, and explain various ways to view the media.

For convenience, refer to this document as "HDG" (short for "HanDuet's Guide").

# Section 2: About the Despecialized Editions

Born out of frustrated fans' failed attempts to convince George Lucas to release the unaltered theatrical versions of the *Star Wars Original Trilogy* films (Episodes IV, V, & VI), the online forum community built around a popular petition hosted at <u>OriginalTrilogy.com</u> turned to discussion of fan edits as a means to obtain their shared goal without Lucas' help. Eventually, a fan restoration project led by <u>Harmy</u> as the primary video editor resulted in the *Despecialized Edition* (abbreviated as "DEED" or "DE").

Since the initial release of the Despecialized Edition of *Star Wars* ["Episode IV: A New Hope"] in 2011, Harmy has since published DEED versions of *The Empire Strike Back* [Episode V, "ESB"] and *Return of the Jedi* [Episode VI, "ROTJ"], and continues to release landmark updates to each of these restored films.

As of March 2024, the Despecialized Edition of *Star Wars* was remastered then recolorized at version 2.7, ESB stands at v2.0 with additional improvements in development, and ROTJ v3.1 implements highly superior source materials allowing for a 4K UltraHD release. If you plan to enjoy Star Wars DEED to the fullest, check for the most current versions (<u>Section 5</u>), and learn how to stay informed (<u>Section 7</u>) so that you'll know of future updates when they're available!

Each of the DEED films includes a combination of three projects: video, audio, and subtitles.

The video itself was painstakingly restored from various sources, including the official Blu-rays, film scans, bonus DVDs, Digital TV broadcasts, and more. All these were gathered from fans around the world, then compiled and underwent massive fine-tuning by **Harmy** and others.

The audio features availability in numerous streams. From 5.1 DTS-HD-MA surround, to 1.0 mono mix to reproduce the feel of the original theatrical showing, to various dubs in a multitude of languages, the sound choices bundled with Harmy's DEED allows the films' sound to accommodate any preference. Most audio work was contributed by **hairy\_hen** and **Belbucus**.

Finally, Harmy's DEED also includes and supports subtitles courtesy of <u>Project Threepio</u> led by **CatBus**. This ongoing fan project provides high-quality subtitles for *Star Wars* films in their unaltered forms in order to broaden the appeal of fan preservation efforts beyond the English-speaking world.

### **HELPFUL TIP:**

Be aware that Star Wars DEED releases may be provided in multiple formats:

- 1) **MKV** (.mkv) the full, complete release with all features
- 2) AVCHD (.iso, BDMV folder) full video with limited extras formatted for Blu-ray Disc
- 3) **NTSC DVD5** (VIDEO\_TS folder) compressed content to fit on a DVD (see <u>Section 6</u> for more info)

Many view *Harmy's Star Wars Trilogy Despecialized Edition* as the quintessential version of the Original Trilogy and a testament to the unwavering dedication of fans inspired by the films. You can learn more about the project's origin, development, and goals by reading this 2015 news article or searching for other online articles, as knowledge of the project has made its way into mainstream media on more than one occasion.

The rest of this guide explains how to obtain and enjoy Harmy's DEED.

# Section 3: Public Torrent Download

Method Summary:	Download verified releases through a public torrent tracker.
Advantages:	Fast download. Relatively simple process.
Disadvantages:	Requires installation of a torrent client. Tracker websites often host intrusive or dangerous ads and illegally pirated content.

### **Preface**

Section 3 describes how to install and use **qBittorrent** to download releases through a public torrent. If you are familiar with torrent downloads or already have a torrent client, simply skip to <a href="Step 4">Step 4</a> of this section.

**NOTICE:** Downloading files by torrent has the risk of exposing your IP address. If privacy is a concern for you, consider alternative download methods, such as described in <u>Section 4</u> or <u>Section 7</u>.

### Step 1

Visit the downloads page for the qBittorrent program, an open-source torrent client: <a href="https://www.qbittorrent.org/download">https://www.qbittorrent.org/download</a>

Find the section for your operating system (Windows, macOS, Linux, etc.), click the "Download gBittorrent" link, then select the file download that best matches your system.


- Windows: If unsure, select "gBittorent Windows x64" installer.
- macOS: If unsure, select "gBittorent MacOS X" installer.

Find the section for your operating system (Windows, macOS, Linux, etc.), click the "Download qBittorrent" link, then select the file download that best matches your system.

# Step 2

Run the downloaded qBittorrent installer. Click **Next** to continue through the installer prompts, selecting any preferences you have.

On the **Choose Components** step, it's recommended to ensure the options are checked to "Open .torrent files with qBittorrent" and "Open magnet links with qBittorrent".



### Step 3

Next, spend a couple minutes to open and view the available program settings under the **Tools > Options** menu, and configure options as you want. For example, you may want to change the folder where your files will be downloaded under **Downloads > Default Save Path**. All default options should work.

For more information about available settings, refer to the gBittorrent wiki.

### Step 4

Go to the **Download Sources guide**: <a href="https://goo.gl/5Sif60">https://goo.gl/5Sif60</a>

Follow the guide's instructions to find the film and release version you want of Harmy's DEED, then use the provided Torrent link.

On the public torrent tracker website, review the torrent description, then select either the **MAGNET DOWNLOAD** or **TORRENT DOWNLOAD** button.


**WARNING:** Public torrent sites are notorious for ads with fake "download" buttons or prompts to download a VPN. To remove these predatory ads, it's **strongly recommended** to use a reputable browser configured for privacy (such as **Brave** or **Mullvad Browser+VPN**), or install a good ad-blocker (like **uBlock Origin**). Be careful to ensure you are selecting a **real download button**, which will likely change color slightly when your mouse pointer hovers over it.



### Step 5

Open the Magnet link or downloaded Torrent file with qBittorrent. After it loads, a window like in the screenshot below is displayed. Use this screen to change any settings you'd like.


The file list displays everything that will be downloaded with the torrent. The folders can be expanded by clicking the small arrows to the left of their listing (green arrow in screenshot). If the download is part of a **bundle**, it provides multiple releases. This may mean it contains other projects or older DEED versions. You can uncheck the folders or files for components you do not want to download (red arrows in screenshot). Click **OK** when ready to continue.



# Step 6

In qBittorrent's list of torrents, select the package you just added, then click the **Resume** green play arrow in the toolbar to start the torrent download. The client will begin

connecting to peers with the files you've selected and begin downloading. Note that you will also begin uploading ("seeding") downloaded parts of the file to others, so this may slow your local network's speed while the torrent is running.



## Step 7

When all selected files are finished downloading, the progress will be shown as 100% and the torrent package will change to "Seeding", which means you are no longer downloading and only uploading to other peers. Keep the filesing seeding for as long as you are willing in order to ensure the files stay available to others! At any time, you can stop seeding by selecting the torrent and clicking the **Pause** orange button in the toolbar, or by completely shutting down qBittorrent.

That's it! See <u>Sections 5-7</u> for additional helpful information.

# Section 4: Multipart RAR Download

Method Summary:	Download multipart RAR files from many links. Automating the process with a download manager is recommended.
Advantages:	Greater privacy. No account creation required.
Disadvantages:	Download speed may be slowed by bandwidth limits imposed by file host site. Optional installation and configuration of a download manager.

### **Preface**

**Steps 1 - 8** describe how to install and use the download manager **JDownloader 2** to automate and speed up the download process. However, the provided download links (<u>Step 6</u>) can be used with any capable download manager, or even accessed directly to manually download each multipart RAR file, and then continue with <u>Step 9</u>.

### Step 1

Java Runtime Environment version 8 ("JRE 8", <u>also known as</u> "Java 8" or "Java 1.8") or newer is required to run the recommended download manager. You probably already have this, but be sure to install or update to the version of Java recommended for your operating system:

# Step 2

Download a "clean" web installer of JDownloader 2 from their officially provided links in this forum post:

https://board.jdownloader.org/showthread.php?t=54725

On the <u>download page</u>, choose your operating system (Windows, macOS, Linux, etc.) and then select the installer option that best matches your system.

- Windows: If unsure, select "(x86, Java 1.8)" installer.
- macOS: If unsure, select "Lion or higher (Java 1.8, Intel)" installer.

**Note:** The <u>main installers of JDownloader</u> are not recommended since they <u>may</u> include adware options.

# Step 3

Run the downloaded web installer and allow JDownloader Setup files to download. When complete, the JDownloader Setup Wizard will open automatically. Click **Next** to continue through the installer, selecting any preferences you have.

Once the installation finishes, a donation window may appear. Donate to the JDownloader developers if desired; otherwise, select **Skip**. Finally, click **Finish** to complete installation and run JDownloader.

### Step 4

Launch the JDownloader program after it finishes installing. Since JDownloader is updated frequently to remain compatible with various host sites, be sure to accept any prompts to run and install updates whenever you open the program. Even if not prompted, it's a good idea to manually check for updates each time you launch JDownloader through the menu option: **Help > Find Updates**.

### Step 5

Next, spend a couple minutes to open and view the available options under the **Settings** tab and configure options as you want. For example, you may want to change the folder where your files will be downloaded.



It's recommended to **DISABLE the Clipboard Observer** (icon circled red in the screenshot above). Otherwise, anytime you copy a URL with JDownloader open in the background, the program will immediately begin analyzing the URL for potential downloads.


If you leave Clipboard Observer enabled, note that Step 7 will be different than described below since the URLs will automatically be added at the end of Step 6.

# Step 6

Go to the **Download Sources guide**: <a href="https://goo.gl/5Sif60">https://goo.gl/5Sif60</a>

Follow the guide's instructions to find the film, release version, and format you want of Harmy's DEED. Take note of the relevant **Password** in that guide's table; it will be needed in the next steps to combine and extract the files!

Use the relevant "Download URLs" link, then scroll through the Pastebin post to find the desired format and version. Under the **Multipart RAR Links** header, select and copy all URLs as shown in the example image below.



# Step 7

Open JDownloader, then follow these numbered actions as shown in the image below:

- (1) Select the Linkgrabber tab.
- (2) Click Add New Links near the bottom left of the window.
- (3) Paste all the copied links in the window (the links may be pasted automatically).
- (4) Enter the password noted in <u>Step 6</u> into the Archive Password field and ensure the "Auto Extract" box is selected.
- (5) Modify any other settings you'd like (such as changing the download location), then click **Continue** to start the analysis of the links.



JDownloader will analyze the links for availability and file size. This may take some time; note that icons in the windows far right corner will show analysis activity taking place.

If any error messages or warnings are encountered at this step, try clearing the LinkGrabber list (delete analyzed links), relaunching JDownloader 2, then repeating this step. If that doesn't work, there may be a temporary issue with some links; you can go ahead and move on to the next step.

# Step 8

Initiate the download by clicking the **Start all Downloads** in the bottom right corner. Alternatively, you can start the download of only selected links if desired.

Go to the **Downloads** tab of JDownloader 2 to monitor the download progress. You may be prompted to accept a website's TOS or enter captchas.

Tip: Find the ".sfv" file in the download list, select it, and move it to the top of the queue by clicking the icon of the green up arrow with a line. Having the SFV file downloaded will allow JDownloader to read its CRC32 checksums to verify the integrity of each multipart RAR file once it downloads!



Example view of a download in progress. Note how some files were skipped after encountering errors, but they have a timer counting down to the next time JDownloader will automatically retry downloading that file.

**NOTICE:** Due to imposed bandwidth limitations of many host sites, it is very likely the download speed will be slowed or stopped occasionally. JDownloader will automatically restart the downloads, but this means **the whole download may take days** depending on the download size.

If you have access to a premium membership account with the relevant file host site, you can enter those credentials in the Account Manager settings of JDownloader 2 to greatly speed up the download. Alternatively, it's possible to reset the bandwidth limits by using a VPN to change your IP address.

# Step 9

Once all links finish downloading, JDownloader should automatically extract and combine the multi-part RAR files into the complete, original files!

Note: If JDownloader does not perform the extraction (or if files were downloaded without a download manager set to perform auto-extraction), this step can be performed manually with a free RAR archive extractor that works with multipart RARs such as 7-Zip (Windows / Linux) or The Unarchiver (Mac). Simply use the RAR extractor to extract the first part of the RAR archive (will say something like "...part01.rar" at the end of the file) and enter the archive password noted in Step 6. [How-to article for more help.]

If the extraction fails, double-check that **all parts are downloaded** and that you're using **the correct archive password**. If neither of those are an issue, find an <u>SFV file verifier</u> for your system that can open the downloaded ".sfv" file and verify the integrity of all multipart RAR files. If any parts are found to be corrupt or missing, redownload those parts, verify their integrity, then reattempt the extraction.

That's it! See Sections 5-7 for additional helpful information.

# Section 5: File Verification (Optional)

This is an *optional* step you can utilize to ensure you find and successfully download the official current versions of *Harmy's Despecialized Editions*. File names, sizes, checksums, and instructions to accomplish this verification are provided at the link below:

# Section 6: Playback

OK, so you've made it this far and finally obtained a copy of the *Despecialized Editions*. Now, how do you watch them? Depending on which version you downloaded, the official files will be in one of three possible formats: MKV, AVCHD, or NTSC DVD5.

The **MKV** (.mkv) releases are the highest-quality, most comprehensive versions, with all the available soundtracks and subtitles included. This version can most easily be converted into other formats with the right programs.

**AVCHD** is formatted for burning onto a Blu-ray Disc (BD) or even a dual-layer DVD (DVD-DL). This version usually downloads as a .ISO file (often with a .MDS file included), or may be a BDMV folder. Not all soundtracks and subtitles are included in this version due to BD limitations. See <a href="this article">this article</a> to learn how to "mount" an .ISO file on Windows, Mac, or Linux.

**NTSC DVD5** is for burning onto a compatible DVD. This version often has a compressed video stream, and may only include a single soundtrack and possibly no subtitles in order to make the files small enough to load onto a DVD.

# **Software Playback**

For viewing directly on your computer (my preferred method), the MKV version is best. If you don't already have a program installed that can play MKV files, here are some recommendations:

<u>VLC</u> (*Windows / Mac / Ubuntu / others*) is a very popular free media player that's compatible with almost all media file types.

MPC-HC (Windows) is a minimalist player and my personal favorite. I recommend downloading and installing codec pack such as K-Lite Codec Pack, which includes MPC-HC bundled with powerful playback options.

Both VLC and MPC-HC can also be used to view the AVCHD / NTSC DVD5 versions on your computer by opening the BDMV or VIDEO TS folder with the media player.

# **Disc Playback**

To store the videos on a disc to playback with a hardware player, you can obtain the AVCHD format (for BD) or the NTSC DVD5 format (for DVD). Then, use a program like <a href="ImgBurn">ImgBurn</a> (Windows) to write the files onto an appropriate disc (<a href="ImgBurn guide for AVCHD files">ImgBurn guide for AVCHD files</a>).

As independent projects, other fans have provided Harmy's DEED in formats designed for disc playback, sometimes with menus and added features. For a definitive Blu-ray Disc collection, the BD set created by **NJVC** is recommended (<u>release info</u> / <u>download instructions</u>), though it may not be available in the latest DEED versions.

# **USB Playback**

If you're wanting to watch on a TV screen but don't want to burn on a disc, some modern TVs and Blu-ray players can play files from a USB drive. Some of them can even play MKV files directly.

Otherwise, you could try converting the MKV file to the widely-compatible .MP4 format with a program like <a href="HandBrake">HandBrake</a> (*Windows / Mac / Ubuntu / others*). Research online as needed to learn about file converting programs.

As stated in <u>Section 2</u>, Harmy and others are constantly working on new versions of the Star Wars Trilogy DEED as better sources, technology, and skills become available.
