For your NOLA redfish trip:

Practice your casting, not just the long cast but practice the 20ft cast, too. So many shots can be really tight to the boat and it's a harder cast to make than most think.

My recommendations:

Rods:

9, 10, 11wt 9 foot rod: If you are thinking about getting a rod, reach out and we can talk through all the options to find what will best fit in your quiver.

My first choice would be the <u>Sage R8 Salt 9wt</u> (is the most powerful), however the Scott Sector is the easiest to cast and the Orvis Helios is going to be the lightest.

For a mid Price Rod the Scott Wave 909-4

Entry level price the Echo Boost Blue or Redington Predator.

Reels: We will rig up and dial in any reel you order from us!

You will want a large arbor with a good drag and plenty of backing capacity. I recommend a 50lb Gel Spun Backing wound on very tight and cross hatched so it does not bind.

First Choice: Hatch Iconic 9+ or 7+ for the 8wt.

Mid Tier: Sage Enforcer Reel

Entry: <u>Redington Grande Or Redington Behemoth</u> (Possible but somewhat disposable option)

Lines:

Floating tropical Saltwater Line: Rio Redfish line is good, as is the SA Grand Slam. We can talk this through and figure out a line best suited for you.

Flies: Lexo's Mudpuppy, #2 Adachi Clouser Joker color, Small Crabs We can put together a selection but your guides will have flies for you. If you have bonefish, crab and shrimpy stuff- bring that along too!

Leaders:

9-10ft 12-25lb Nylon Leaders with 16lb and 20lb being the core sizes.

Clothing: Layer up, your run in the morning can be chilly, so bring a puffy jacket and a raincoat for when you are running in the boat. By afternoon it will likely heat up, so lightweight sun hoody is a great base layer. Be ready for rain squalls.

A dry bag for the boat is helpful to keep your layers dry as you shed them. I like waterproof backpacks for this, <u>Simms makes the best one!</u>

Don't forget.... Polarized sunglasses are a MUST!
