

Libertarian Transcript/Video Description

Cameron: I will explain the Libertarian (“L”) Party’s Presidential Candidate. Her name is Jo Jorgensen. She is 63 years old. Jo was born in Libertyville, Illinois. She worked *sign unclear* rights and liberty. She attended Clemson University in South Carolina.

Pax: Now we will discuss 3 hot topics: immigration, education, and environment. I will explain what the Libertarian Party’s opinion is about these topics. I will start with immigration. The party states, “The freedom to trade and travel is very fundamental to human’s liberty, as an American citizens we should be able to travel anywhere we choose, to buy and sell anywhere in the world. As a President I will use my constitutional authority to remove the trading barriers.” The Party also said “I will remove the system where they will limit how many people can immigrate to America.”

Now onto education. They believe the Department of Education has failed us. Over the past 40 years since the Department of Education was created, the government's spending has increased, and the quality of education has declined. Jorgensen said that as president, she will work to remove the Department of Education and return the control to where it belongs: with parents, teachers, and students.

Now onto the last topic, the environment. Jorgensen said that she will work to remove government protections and replace the coal-burning and oil burning power plants in the USA with non-pollution, safe, and high tech nuclear power plants. She also said that she will work to implement off-grid use of solar power. She believes that we need all the scientific evidence to support and protect our environment instead of making up the data we use to protect our environment.
