What do you do if you are a close contact??? If a student or staff member is identified as a close contact to a school-associated case, (within 6 feet for 15 minutes or more cumulatively in a 24 hour period), please choose from one of the 3 options below. Individuals that are close contacts to a positive case that is NOT a school-associated case, can only choose from option 1 or 2. All information is aligned with CCPHD guidance.

Exemptions from any required quarantine or testing:

- K-12 Student aged 5-17 has received primary series of vaccine
- Student or Staff 18 years or older and has received all of recommended vaccine doses, including boosters and additional primary shots for some immunocompromised people.
- Student or Staff has received a positive COVID-19 test result in the last 90 days
- Student/Staff was exposed in a classroom or bus setting with universal masking present

What do you do if you test positive??? If a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19, they can now choose from the following isolation procedures. Please contact your school office as soon as possible to notify them of positive test results. All information is aligned with CCPHD guidance.

Option 1 - Out of School 10 Days	Option 2: Out of School 5 Days, Negative Test to Return Early on Day 6	
Complete full 10 Day Isolation No testing required	Return on Day 6 with a negative test on Day 6. Symptoms must be resolving and be noticeably better. If asymptomatic upon first test, and symptoms develop, 5 day isolation begins over!
