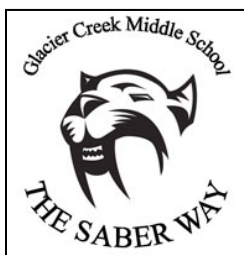

- **Important note: Only 5th graders and 8th grade WEB leaders will attend school on Thursday, August 31, from 8 am-12 pm. September 5 is the first full day of school for all students.**
- **Chromebooks and Lockers:** Students will receive their locker information and combinations in their first hour advisory class. Returning Glacier Creek Students should have their chromebook from last year and should return to school with it charged and ready to use. A small number of students turned their chromebook in for repair and will pick the chromebook up in their advisory. 5th grade chromebooks are provided in the classroom.

- **Bus Routes:** Routes, pick up, and drop off times will go live in late August and can be found through the Infinite Campus portal. Parent access to times and pick up locations will be communicated when they are available in Infinite Campus.

SCHOOL PICTURES

School pictures will be taken by HR imaging on Tuesday, September 12, during the school day. All students will have their picture taken regardless if they wish to buy a picture package or not. HEALTH CONCERNS AND PROCEDURE FOR MEDICATIONS

The following guidelines will be followed when medication is administered to students:

Non-prescription (over the counter) medication will be administered by district personnel upon receipt of:

1. Written instruction and written consent by the parent/guardian.
2. Medication supplied by the parent/guardian in the original container with dosage instructions and labeled with the student's name.
3. Parent/guardian consent forms are available in the health office and will be available at Student Information Day.

Prescription medication will be administered by district personnel upon receipt of:

1. Written instruction and written consent by the parent/guardian.
2. Written instructions of the practitioner.
3. Medication supplied by the parent/guardian in the original container with the child's full name, name of the drug and dosage, time to be given and practitioner's name.
4. The order on the medication container must match the written instructions of the practitioner (child's full name, name of the drug and dosage and time to be given).
5. Practitioner forms for prescription medication administration are available in the health offices and many practitioners' offices have generic school health forms.

Medication administered by school personnel will be kept in a locked, secure place. It is the responsibility of the student to get his/her medication at the designated time. Only empty medication containers will be sent home from school with a student, for safety reasons. The parent must reclaim all medication at the end of the school year or it will be discarded.

Asthmatic students may possess and use a metered dose inhaler or dry powdered inhaler upon receipt of the completed District's Medication Release form. This form has the written approval of the student's practitioner and the written approval of the student's Parent or guardian.

Families prepay for school meals using one of three methods; using our online payment system, sending a check or bringing credit or debit card or cash to the Nutrition Services office, 2130 Pinehurst Dr. Middleton, WI 53562, or dropping off payment in the dropbox at each school. Families can pay online at MyPaymentsPlus.com to manage student account(s). To access your student account(s), you will need each student's district ID number.

A La Carte Purchases: Parental permission is required for middle students to charge extra food, including a second entree item or a la carte items such as snacks. You can set up permission on the MyPaymentsPlus site by clicking on My Account-Spending Alerts & Limits- ALA CARTE SPENDING LIMITS. Paper forms will also be available from School Nutrition staff.

Payments made at individual school buildings with students must be deposited in the Lunch Express drop boxes located in each building. At Glacier Creek, the drop box is located on the storage door opposite the kitchen serving area. Please be aware that payments received in the building drop boxes rather than the central location and online services will not be credited to your account for an average of 1-2 school days.
