Introduction:

hiya !! welcome to pho's scuffed bard oli crochet doll pattern :) [as seen in <u>this</u> <u>post!</u>]

a quick Q&A and/or disclaimer before we begin:

"why is this pattern scuffed?" — because I'm not a professional pattern writer! this is me messing around, finding out, and doing my best to write down what the heck I just did to the best of my ability. I'm also bad at explaining things like crochet terminology, so I'd recommend looking up (american) crochet terms/abbreviations before starting if needed!

"why else is this pattern scuffed??" — because I used yarns of varying thicknesses, so some of the stitch counts are a little bit off (ie, having an extra 2+ rows be the yarn is thinner than normal, etc) and will (probably) need adjusting if you plan on using yarns of consistent thicknesses.

"what yarn colors in your pattern need special attention?" — the gold yarn, the hair color, and the white(s) I used were all thinner than standard yarn. the gold was mostly for detailing, the hair only affects the hair, and the extra rows I added for my white yarn sections can be disregarded if your yarn is normal thickness compared to the others!

"what supplies do I need?" — here's a breakdown of the things I used!

- Yarn (duh) (look at the pictures to pick out what colors you need!)
- Hook (I used 4.25-G mostly)
- Needle (for sewing things on)
- Stuffing
- Safety eyes (could also just embroider them on)
- Stitch marker (optional, but useful!)
- Scissors

- Pins
- Glue (also optional)

"how did you come up with this?" — the base doll pattern was modified from THIS PATTERN !!! if you want to just do whatever you want, I recommend using this as a starting point and going from there!

"anything else?" — idk there's probably other funky things happening lol, I just hope you have fun and make it your own:)

PATTERN STARTS HERE !!!

Legs:

```
(make two (2) legs!)

Gold:
1: 5 sc in mc (5)
2: inc around (10)
3: (sc, inc) repeat around (15)
4: sc around (15)
5: BLO around (15)

Red:
5: sc around (15)
6: 3sc, 5dec, 2sc (10)
7: sc around (10)
```

White:

8-14: sc around (10) (I added +4 rows for thinness of my yarn)

(I'd recommend watching the base doll pattern tutorial (linked in intro) to see how the two legs are joined together to make the body in the next step)

Body:

```
White:
15: join legs together, sc around (20)
16-18: sc around (20)
19: (8sc, dec) 2x (18)
20-22: sc around (18) (I added +2 more rows for thinness here)
23: (4sc, dec) 3x (15)
24: sc around (15)
25: (sc, dec) around (10)
Skin:
26: inc around (20)
27: (sc, inc) around (30)
28: (4sc, inc) around (36)
29-30: sc around (36)
31: (4sc, dec) around (30)
(eyes go here!!)
32-35: sc around (30)
36: (3sc, dec) around (24)
37: (2sc, dec) around (18)
38: (sc, dec) around (12)
39: dec around (6)
Tie off
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[note: if you want to, you can use some of the tie off yarn to crochet a little nose by wrapping it around a few stitches below + between the eyes!]

at this point, your doll should look something like this!



[another quick note: I ultimately didn't add ears to my doll, but if you wanted to, you can do it by using skin color and doing (4sc in mc) for each ear — more details are in the base doll tutorial if needed!]

Arms:

(make two (2) arms!)

```
Skin:
1: 6sc in mc
2: (2sc, inc) around (8)
3: sc around (8)
4: (2sc, dec) around (6)
5: sc around (6)
Blue:
6-10: sc around (6)
11: 3 dc inc, 3 sc (9)
12: 6 dc, 3 sc (9)
13: 2 triple dec (incomplete round) (5)
Tie off with tail for sewing arm onto body
[note: do NOT sew arms on until AFTER the jacket is done!!]
Sleeve Cuffs:
(make one of each piece for both arms!)
Outside piece — Blue:
ch14
Starting in second loop from hook, (2 dc, dc inc) across (16)
Inside piece — White:
13 ch
Start in first loop from hook, sc across
Gold rim:
Ch14
```

If the lengths are too long/short to wrap around your arm, adjust them as necessary :)

Use additional gold to embroider whatever other details you wish!

here is an image showing the sleeve detailing + where I was trying to position the arms on the body!



Shoe Details:

```
Use gold to make buckles.
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Top cuff thing — Red:
ch17
sc across (16)
Tie off with tail for sewing.
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[Sew the cuffs on AFTER doing the pants, in case the pants won't fit over edges !!!]

Pants:

```
Make x2 — Red:
ch19, join into ring
1: sc around (18)
2: sc around (18)
3: (4sc, dec) around (15)
4: sc around (15)
5: sc around (15)
-
6: join two legs together, sc around (30)
7: sc around (30)
8: sc around (30)
9: (4sc, dec) around (25)
10: sc around (25)
11: sc around (25)
```

ch16, tie off leaving a long tail for sewing Make 10x, attach to pants

(*because my gold yarn was thin, I made them longer + added more of them - you may want shorter + fewer stripes on yours, that's perfectly fine!!)

here is my doll before stripes + with half the shoe details done lol



use red yarn to sew the pants on around the waist + bottom of legs to create the "puffiness" you desire :)

Jacket:

Blue:

1: Ch 19. Work in turning rows, starting from 2nd ch from hook. Don't count 1 ch at the beginning of each row as a stitch.

2: Sc in next 18 (18)

3: Ch1, (5sc, inc) x3 (21)

4: Ch1, (6sc, inc) x3 (24)

5-12: Ch1, sc in next 24 (24)

sc around edge, tie off

Jacket Collar — Blue:

1: ch19

2: sc in next 18 (18)

3: Ch1, (2sc, inc) x6 (24)

4: Ch1, (3sc, inc) x6 (30)

sc around edge with gold

use blue yarn to attach top of jacket around the neck/shoulders + to sew the collar along the top edge.

here is a side view of my doll with the jacket + collar, pant stripes, and the rest of the shoe details lol



he looks like a snazzy fresno nightcrawler

Scarf:

tbh I fr just made this part up I have no idea what this means. do whatever you want forever, but here's what I wrote down just in case:

White:

magic circle ch3, dc 3x back ch3, (sc in next stitch, ch3) x2, slip stitch Tie off, weave into magic circle Wrap yarn around magic circle loop to make puffy top Tie off end, sew on

the goal is something that looks fancy and big and puffy. add that 👍



Hat:

(I modified it from THIS pattern!)

Red:

- 1: 6sc in mc (6)
- 2: inc around (12)
- 3: (sc, inc) around (18)
- 4: (2 sc, inc) around (24)
- 5: 6 sc, 3 hdc, 6 dc, 3 hdc, 6 sc (24)
- 6: sc around (24)
- 7: (sc, dec) x2, 6 dec, (sc, dec) 2x (14)

Gold Detailing:

sc in 9 stitches (centering them on the edge of the hat that does NOT have hat hanging over it), sl st in next stitch, ch1 + turn, sc back in same stitches as before (double layering on same row) (<- I did that because of yarn thinness, you may just have to do it once to make it sufficiently thick/bold/whatever)

```
Hat Feather*:
ch 12
starting in 2nd loop from hook, sl st 4x
sc in next 4
sl st in next 3
sl st x1 more time in last stitch to turn
-
on other side of chain:
5 sl st
3 sc
2 sl st
tie off, weaving in tail to hide it
```

I used the tail from the start of the initial chain to sew on the base of the feather, but you could also just glue it onto the hat!

(*this was a different white yarn that matched the thinness of the gold detail yarn I used — numbers may need adjusting!)

gay little hat close up:



Hair:

this was another case of thinner than normal yarn — as such, all of the stitch counts are going to be off if you're using normal yarn! I recommend using the same basic concept (magic circle, increase to size, FLO round, strands of various lengths) and adjusting the sizes to best suit your yarn and preferred lengths!

also, to have the hair naturally "swoop" in two different directions for a middle part, I did two different halves. meaning, I crocheted one side from

back to front, tied off the yarn, rejoined the yarn in the back, and crocheted to the front again BUT in the style of LEFT HANDED CROCHET so it was MIRRORED. it was a little tricky, but it looked exactly how I wanted it to with the swoops.

alternatively you could just do it normally and deal with the hair swoop in only one direction. which is probably way easier tbh

Blonde:

1: 7sc in mc (7)

2: inc around (14)

3: FLO (inc, sc) around (21)

Add strands! (ch to length, then sc back along chain + sc in next stitch in circle)

All strand Lengths:

- 16 (x6)
- 14 (x1)
- 12 (x1)
- 11 (x1)
- 10 (x2) ** these are the two front center strands!
- 11 (x1)
- 12 (x1)
- 14 (x1)
- 16 (x7) ** there's an odd number, so do (x6) in one direction and (x7) in other

One "half" (start in back, tie off, rejoin in back, do other half in other direction):

- 16 (x6 or x7)
- 14 (x1)
- 12 (x1)
- 11 (x1)
- 10 (x1)

to finish the hair, use pins to decide where all the strands are going to go. then, either sew or glue the hair strands to the head in whatever arrangement you decide. add the hat on top when you're done!

here's the front of my hair + hat pinning arrangement:



Final Notes:

aaand once everything is assembled and sewn together, you're done!!!

congrats on making it through and surviving my insanity! I hope you had fun ^^

I wish I'd taken more/better progress photos and written better notes, but like I said at the start, I'm far from a professional pattern writer and it didn't even occur to me that it might be important to do for later until it was too late. (this was also not helped by procrastinating for months and forgetting what I'd done when I came back to it... oops!)

(and if you actually go through with making this pattern, please please show it to me!!! I'd love to see it!!!)
