ON THE QUESTION: Mayor Hogan read a recommendation from Capt. Ted Murray and Chief Crowe for Police Officer Speed's permanent appointment.

- Capt. Murray notified the Board about a Wednesday evening drug raid, led by Inv. Aini and Sgt. Sexsmith, which netted a quarter-pound of mushrooms during a house search. "That's quite a dangerous drug because we see it more and more distributed to children," Capt. Murray said.
- Chief Crowe thanked the Board of Public Safety, Chief Kelly, and the community for their support of him throughout the years. "It's been a great honor to work with you," he said. Mayor Hogan said Chief Crowe was "a real pleasure to work with," adding, "It's an end of an era. There's always a new era to carry on, but this one was significant." Chief Kelly expressed his appreciation of Chief Crowe, and Capt. Murray added the Police Department's gratitude for Chief Crowe's leadership.
- Mayor Hogan noted the examination for the new Police Chief would be held Saturday in Hammondsport. He wished Capt. Murray and the other three candidates well.
- Chief Crowe reminded commissioners that the Deputy Commissioner for the State Department of Criminal Justice Services will be at the Hornell Police Department at 1 p.m. Tuesday, March 13, 2007, for an accreditation ceremony.
