<u>Course Overview:</u> The course includes Common Core Standards (CCS) for English Language Arts. Students will use supplemental materials and the textbook from *Savvas - My Perspectives*. Located in Clever, **Savvas - My Perspectives** will allow students to collaborate and engage in classroom discussions that encourage them to think critically about what they read and write. Students will focus on **Unit 1:** Survival **Unit 2:** Promise and Progress **Unit 3:** Crazy, Stupid Love **Unit 4:** Journey of Transformation **5:** The Things We Make

Our learning management will be done on **Schoology** (School-o-gy) which is located through Clever. In Schoology, you will find your assignments, due dates, grades and resources for class.

# **Classroom Rules and Expectations**

- 1. All school policies and classroom rules will be enforced.
- 2. At all times, students and teachers will treat each other with mutual respect.
- 3. **Tardy policy**: Arrive to class late. (1<sup>st</sup> violation = warning; 2<sup>nd</sup> violation = student conference; 3<sup>rd</sup> violation- detention.) Students should be seated by the first bell. Tardy students will sign their name and the time on the sheet by the door.
- 4. **Attendance**: Students who are absent are expected to bring an **excused absence note to school and/or call the school secretary at 216-838-0500**. **Make-up policy**: Students will have the opportunity to make-up individual work. Assignments for group work cannot be made up. It is expected if you have internet access you complete your individual task in the group assignment.
- 6. **Late Work:** Homework and daily assignments are due as assigned. Reduction in point value.
- 7. Revision of assignments: Students are encouraged to revise any assignments to improve their score and demonstrate mastery.
- 8. **Dress Code policy**: Students are expected to be in dress code daily. Students will not be allowed to wear hoodies, ski masks or bonnets in class.

- 9. All required materials must be brought daily. Laptops are to be treated respectfully.
- 10. No food or drink (except bottled water) allowed in class. Except when the teacher provides it.
- **11. Cell Phone Policy:** Phones should be confiscated at the start of school. However, if a student is caught on his/her cell phone at any other time, it may be confiscated until the end of the class or school day.
- 12. Students may have headphones/earbuds to use for required learning videos at the teacher discretion.
- 13. **Passes:** Students may not leave the classroom the first or last ten minutes of class. Students may be given passes to leave the classroom after instruction.
