

# MASTER Safer West County Defensible Space Rebate Project Project Information

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## The Safer West County Defensible Space Rebate Project

Defensible space is essential to improve your home's chance of surviving a wildfire. Defensible space is the buffer you create between your home and the flammable vegetation and other flammable items surrounding it. By creating a fire resistant area around your home, you can help protect your home from catching fire. It also gives firefighters a safe, nonflammable area to work in to defend your home.

[Safer West County](#) (a 501(c)(3)), in conjunction with [Fire Safe Sonoma](#), has received a Hazardous Fuels Reduction Grant from CAL FIRE to reduce fire fuels in four Western Sonoma County communities. **This project will provide up to 400 households across Occidental, Camp Meeker, Monte Rio, and Forestville with rebates for defensible space work around their homes and structures.**

Rebates cover two-thirds of the total project costs up to \$1,000. We recognize that these limited funds will only go so far. We recommend that participants use the rebate to treat the most critical area for fire protection on their property, which is "Zone 0," the 5-foot space immediately around the footprint of your home. *UPDATE: **Applicants must submit completed rebate requests by December 1, 2025 to be eligible for the rebate.** Rebate amounts are subject to change at the discretion of the grant administrators. Payments will be distributed by December 31, 2025.*

## How do I participate?

### Step 1: Submit an [Application to Participate in the Project](#)

### Step 2: Schedule Your Defensible Space Assessment

Once the application has been submitted, a volunteer assessor will contact you to schedule a visit to the property in order to conduct a full assessment of its defensible space. After the assessment, you will receive a report through a website called Fire Aside with recommended actions and eligible rebate activities identified.

### Step 3: Review Your Assessment and Pre-Work Photos

Once your assessment is ready, you can open your Fire Aside account online to review your report. Your report will have recommended actions and eligible rebate activities identified. You will find that each issue identified has a description, photo and recommended action.

### Step 4: Choose Your Activities

An assessment might identify a lot of work to be done to get your property up to code with [Public Resources Code 4291](#). Determine which of the recommended actions you will take for

your participation in the project. Remember that the rebate will cover two-thirds of your contractor's costs, up to \$1,000. From the date that you receive your defensible space assessment, you have 6 months or until **December 1, 2025**, whichever comes first, to hire your contractor, complete the improvements, and submit all required documentation.

### **Step 5: Hire Your Contractor**

Hire any contractor you like. CAL FIRE will not reimburse sweat-equity (do-it-yourself labor) from applicants on this project. For your convenience, we have assembled a list of local contractors ([click here to see the list](#)). Note that Safer West County and Fire Safe Sonoma make no representation about the quality of work performed by these listed contractors; using the contractors on this list is not required.

### **Step 6: Get the Work Done**

The contractor's invoice must contain the entity's business name and billing information, invoice number, the client name and address where work was conducted, the date and itemized list describing the completed work, the total project cost, the payment due date, and the project grant number: 5GA21140. This [invoice template](#) (created for your reference and use if needed) reflects everything we require.

### **Step 7: Take Photos**

The work done must match what is identified in the assessment. Applicants must submit after-work photos that match up with the pre-work photos in their assessment for the activity to be eligible for the rebate. Photos must match the vantage of the pre-work photos taken in the assessment to assist us in verifying that the work identified matches the work that you completed.

### **Step 8: Request Your Rebate**

You'll need to submit an eligible contractor's invoice, project photos, and IRS Form W-9 in order to be eligible for the rebate.

### **Step 9: Certify Completion**

The SWC team will review the after-work photos, invoice, and W-9. If the work was performed appropriately and all materials submitted are complete, a rebate will be approved and sent to the mailing address provided within 30 days of review and approval. **Payments will be distributed by December 31, 2025.**

## **Eligibility**

### **Requirement**

1. The applicant must be the property owner.

2. The property must be within the Project Area. [View the Project Area map](#) here.
3. The applicant must be at least 18 years of age.
4. Mailing addresses and bank accounts must be located within California.

## Required Documents

**At the time that you request your rebate, you will be asked to provide:**

- **IRS Form W-9** (Request for Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification): Rebate dollars may be considered taxable. Participants must submit a [Form W-9](#) in order to receive their rebate.
- **After-work photos to match the pre-work photos:** Photos that show the defensible space improvements. The photos should match the area photographed in the pre-work photos. [See an example of before-and-after photos here.](#)
- **Eligible Contractor invoice(s):** Only invoices provided by a contractor (an entity such as a landscaper or tree crew) are eligible for the rebate. Eligible invoices must also include the property owner's name and address, the entity's business name and billing information, invoice number, the date and description of work, itemized activity costs, the total project cost, the payment due date, and the project grant number (5GA21140) in a notes or additional information section. As noted above, this [invoice template](#) (created for your reference and use if needed) reflects everything we require and can be used in lieu of one from your contractor.

## Important Reminders

**Application Review:** Application review can take 30 days upon receipt.

**Completing work:** Once an applicant has received their defensible space assessment through Fire Aside, the applicant has a 6-month grace period, or until **December 1, 2025**, whichever comes first, to hire their contractor, complete their defensible space work, and request their rebate. If an applicant is unable to hire their contractor within the grace period, they may notify us and request an extension.

**Rebate requests** can take 30 days to process.

**End of the Project:** **Applicants must submit completed rebate requests by December 1, 2025 to be eligible for the rebate.** Payments will be distributed until **December 31, 2025**, or until funds are no longer available, whichever condition occurs first.

## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

### 1. What is defensible space? How do I make it around my home and structures?

Defensible space is essential to improve your home's chance of surviving a wildfire. Defensible space is the buffer you create between your home and flammable vegetation and other flammable items surrounding it. By creating a fire resistant area around your home, you can help protect your home from catching fire. It also gives firefighters a safe, nonflammable area to work in to defend your home.

This rebate project is meant to assist you in complying with the law. The defensible space assessment you receive through this project is not an inspection, but rather an educational guide with a list of defensible space treatment opportunities. It acts as a roadmap to a more fire-resilient property and community.

Participating homeowners will work to accomplish a three-tiered setback around buildings that totals 100 feet and meets the guidelines set forth in California Public Resources Code Section §4291:

#### **Zone 0 – Ember-Resistant Zone**

*Zone 0 extends 5 feet from buildings, structures, decks, etc.*

The ember-resistant zone is currently not required by law, but science has proven it to be the most important of all the defensible space zones. This zone includes the area under and around all attached decks, and requires the most stringent wildfire fuel reduction. The ember-resistant zone is designed to keep fire or embers from igniting materials that can spread the fire to your home. The following provides guidance for this zone, which may change based on the regulation developed by the Board of Forestry and Fire Protection.

- Use hardscape like gravel, pavers, concrete and other noncombustible mulch materials. No combustible bark or mulch
- Remove all dead and dying weeds, grass, plants, shrubs, trees, branches and vegetative debris (leaves, needles, cones, bark, etc.); Check your roofs, gutters, decks, porches, stairways, etc.
- Remove all branches within 10 feet of any chimney or stovepipe outlet
- Limit combustible items (outdoor furniture, planters, etc.) on top of decks
- Relocate firewood and lumber to Zone 2

- Replace combustible fencing, gates, and arbors attach to the home with noncombustible alternatives
- Consider relocating garbage and recycling containers outside this zone
- Consider relocating boats, RVs, vehicles and other combustible items outside this zone

### **Zone 1 – Lean, Clean and Green Zone**

*Zone 1 extends 30 feet from buildings, structures, decks, etc. or to your property line, whichever is closer.*

- Remove all dead plants, grass and weeds (vegetation).
- Remove dead or dry leaves and pine needles from your yard, roof and rain gutters.
- Remove branches that hang over your roof and keep dead branches 10 feet away from your chimney.
- Trim trees regularly to keep branches a minimum of 10 feet from other trees.
- Relocate wood piles to Zone 2.
- Remove or prune flammable plants and shrubs near windows.
- Remove vegetation and items that could catch fire from around and under decks, balconies and stairs.
- Create a separation between trees, shrubs and items that could catch fire, such as patio furniture, wood piles, swing sets, etc.

### **Zone 2 – Reduce Fuel Zone**

*Zone 2 extends from 30 feet to 100 feet out from buildings, structures, decks, etc. or to your property line, whichever is closer.*

- Cut or mow annual grass down to a maximum height of 4 inches.
- Create horizontal space between shrubs and trees. (See diagram)
- Create vertical space between grass, shrubs and trees. (See diagram)
- Remove fallen leaves, needles, twigs, bark, cones, and small branches. However, they may be permitted to a depth of 3 inches.
- All exposed wood piles must have a minimum of 10 feet of clearance, down to bare mineral soil, in all directions.

### **Zone 1 and 2 - Outbuildings and Propane Tanks**

“Outbuildings” and Liquid Propane Gas (LPG) storage tanks shall have 10 feet of clearance to bare mineral soil and no flammable vegetation for an additional 10 feet around their exterior.

**2. Are landowners required to maintain defensible space by law?**

Yes. In the unincorporated areas of Sonoma County, landowners are required to comply with California Public Resources Code Section §4291. [Learn more about defensible space law and see CAL FIRE’s defensible space guidelines here.](#)

**3. What if I already did the work? Can I be reimbursed for past work?**

Generally, no, however it may be possible. Please reach out to Safer West County if this situation is relevant at [Rebates@SaferWestCounty.org](mailto:Rebates@SaferWestCounty.org).

**4. Can I do my own work and get paid for it?**

Unfortunately, no. This grant does not pay for do-it-yourself, sweat-equity labor. Applicants can only receive rebates for invoices from qualified contractors.

**5. Can I apply with a paper application rather than online?**

**6. What if I want to purchase materials (gravel, weedcloth, etc.)?**

Unfortunately, rebate funds cannot be used to reimburse the cost of materials, such as gravel, purchased by the landowner or your contractor.

**7. What if I can’t hire my contractor within the 6-month grace period?**

If you are unable to hire your contractor within the 6-month grace period, you can request an extension with a reasonable explanation for the delay.

**8. May I apply for the rebate multiple times?**

Generally, no. However, there are some exceptions:

- If you applied once and did not receive the full \$1,000 rebate the first time, you may apply again to reach the maximum \$1,000.
- If you have multiple structures or properties and they each have unique addresses, you may apply once for each address. This project will accept one application per address; this includes but is not limited to homes, apartments, granny units, and studios with their own addresses.

**9. May I request that the rebate check be mailed to my contractor directly?**

Unfortunately we are unable to accommodate that request.

**10. Does this project encourage neighbors to work together on defensible space projects?**

Yes. Our preference is for several connecting or neighboring properties applying in the same year. Our goal is to help not just individual residents but entire neighborhoods to

become more fire safe. Also, it's possible that if multiple neighbors use the same contractor during the same time period, costs may be lowered.

**11. Is other assistance available for residents to create defensible space?**

Yes, other assistance is available in many forms:

- Hand tools are available to rent at no cost through [Fire Safe Sonoma's Tool Trailer](#). Tools include chainsaws, loppers, uprooters, pruners, limbing and pole saws, gloves, tarps, rakes, wheelbarrow, and shovels.

Safer West County leads community outreach and engagement for this Project. Gold Ridge Resource Conservation District provides administrative and project management support. The Project Platform is a software service provided by Fire Aside, a for-profit third-party company. The Project Platform collects your name, property address, email address, and other information on our in-take form. When you submit an application, we collect your name, address and email address, as well as information regarding your property. We do not use your personal information in any automated decision-making. We do collect information that does not identify you personally, but that becomes available to us as a result of your visit to our Site.

#### When We May Share Your Information

Fire Safe Sonoma, Safer West County, and Gold Ridge Resource Conservation District may share your information with CAL FIRE for grant reporting purposes. Fire Safe Sonoma, Safer West County, and Gold Ridge Resource Conservation District may also share your information on a confidential basis with assessors, contractors, service providers and agents solely for Fire Safe Sonoma, Safer West County, and Gold Ridge Resource Conservation District projects, education and outreach, support for emergency response and other business purposes. Otherwise, we will not sell, rent or grant access to your information to any other party without your consent. However, we may be required by law to disclose personal information without your consent in the event of emergency situations or when required by government or other legal authority. We use industry standard encryption algorithms and best practice configurations to ensure security of data transmissions. Credit card information is not collected.

### Guidelines for Minors

Minors in the country, state or province in which they live, may use the Safer West County, Gold Ridge Resource Conservation District, and Fire Safe Sonoma websites only in accordance with applicable laws in their respective country or state, and in any case, only with the approval of a parent or guardian. ### **Property Owner Responsibility to PRC 4291**

In January 2005 California revised the state law that requires homeowners to create a firebreak, known as "Defensible Space" around their homes. Sections 4290 and 4291 of the California Public Resources Code are the laws that require property owners in California to establish "Defensible Space." The law now requires property owners to extend Defensible Space clearance around homes and structures from 30 feet to 100 feet. This rebate Project is meant to assist you in complying with the law. The defensible space assessment you receive through this Project is not an inspection, but rather an educational guide with recommended defensible

space treatments that this Project can fund. Moreover, it acts as a roadmap to a more fire-resilient property and community.

## Safer West County's List of Local Defensible Space Contractors

Businesses included in this list have expressed that they have (1) the adequate knowledge of and familiarity with the defensible space requirements as codified in California Public Resources Code [Section 4291](#) and enforced by the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection ([CAL FIRE](#)) within their jurisdiction, and (2) the means (skills, labor, equipment, etc.) to adequately create and/or maintain structural defensible space for properties in western Sonoma County. They have also provided 3 references that vouch the quality of their work. This information is provided to help residents find the right contractor. However, it is up to the resident to determine the scope of work appropriate and services to be rendered for their project.

**For Safer West County Defensible Space Rebate Project Applicants:** If indicated, the contractor is willing to hold a net-45 day payment term and willing to receive payment in two installations (if desired by the resident): One initial payment from the resident and the rebate contribution from the program. Residents must arrange for a net-45 day payment term and split payment with their contractor before requesting their rebate.

## Defensible Space Services:

- Limb** vegetation overhanging the roof and/or chimney
- Move** easily ignitable materials such as firewood and combustible furnishings away from the home
- Haul** debris off site
- Remove** combustible mulch
- Mow grass** to a height less than 4"
- Remove** dead wood on ground
- Trim or Remove** shrubs positioned under the tree line such that a surface fire cannot reach the tree crown
- Limb** lower tree branches (15 ft) such that a surface fire cannot reach the tree crown
- Remove** dead and dying plant material and dead tree branches within trees and/or shrubs
- Create** separations between groupings of shrubs and bushes (islands) that are continuously maintained
- Create** crown-to-crown tree separation (minimum of 10 feet) from drip line to drip line at mature size
- Remove** new growth crown sprouts and or fir/pine seedlings and saplings
- Remove** ALL live and dead invasive vegetation, such as French Broom, Ivy, Himalayan blackberry, etc.
- Remove** whole trees (*under* 8 inches diameter at breast height)
- Remove** whole trees (*over* 8 inches diameter at breast height)
- Certified arborist** on staff

Circuit Rider crews are trained and skilled in the use of chainsaws, pole saws, weedwhackers, trimmers, handsaws, rakes, McLeods, Pulaskis, pruning shears, broom pullers, brush cutters, machetes, and/or shovels, etc. to perform thinning, pruning, and invasive species removal for the creation of defensible space and fire fuels reduction. Circuit Rider is equipped with the full suite of vegetation management tools including a Bandit 12-inch XPC chipper. Circuit Rider crews are experienced with the construction of 4-by-4-foot burn piles as well as the ignition and safe burning procedures using drip torches and hand tools. The crew also uses a 300-gallon water trailer with 200-foot hose reel as a water tender."*
