

Coaching in your hometown is special, and I have had that privilege on two occasions, beginning in Wayland, where my parents moved in the early 1950's, and then in Northborough, the town I moved to in 1990. My stepdaughter, Jen, became interested in lacrosse, but since I coached at Wayland High School, how would I ever see her play? Well, when God closes a door, he opens a window. In 1996, my daughter Hayley was born with extensive developmental disabilities, which became a life-altering moment for our family. In 1997, I temporarily retired from teaching and coaching, but in the fall of that year, the Algonquin varsity field hockey coaching position was vacant, and rumors were floating that lacrosse would become a varsity sport at Algonquin in 1998. Jen encouraged me to apply.

A wonderful part of my life began with Algonquin field hockey in 1997. Varsity lacrosse was born in 1998 and in June 2001 we were one game away from hosting the Massachusetts State Championship game. The experience of coaching Jen (3 years field hockey, 4 years lacrosse, and not missing any of her games!), her friends, classmates, neighbors, and all of the students and their families in the Northborough and Southborough communities remains a gift to me and my family.

I was introduced to Algonquin Athletics by Vincent Damore (Hall of Fame 2003) and greatly supported by Fran Whitten (Hall of Fame 2019). I have lifelong gratitude to the Algonquin community for this honor, and for joining Jen in the Hall of Fame.





In my third year at Algonquin Coach Boschetto and Coach Morin recognized that there was community interest in track but the program had become stagnant, with minimal participation. They started a track and field camp for the middle school students from Southborough and Northborough and built the amazing program that exists today. This kind of leadership and drive helped me to see that anything is possible with a little planning and a little drive. And so, looking back, it's not the competitions I think about most often, but the help I received along the way. Coach Boschetto and Coach Morin gave me the freedom to explore whatever events most interested me, providing instruction, support and the power to choose. Coach Boschetto supported me off the field as well, advocating for me with teachers and changing the course of my life. I was very fortunate to excel at Track and Field, which allowed me to pay for college and gave me freedom when I left college, as I did not carry school debt. If we did not have a track program at Algonquin my life would be very different.

When we talk about sports it's usually in terms of winning and losing, but not often about the moment we are in while we are there. Algonquin provided a safe place to grow, to be myself, and to become the person I wanted to be. I won. Thanks for the help Algonquin.
