OFFICIAL RULES - Kentucky Golden Owl Award® Contest

These are the Official Rules of the Ohio Golden Owl Award® Contest ("Contest"). The Contest is co-sponsored by the Kentucky FFA Foundation, PO Box 8, Flemingsburg, KY 41041; and Nationwide Mutual Insurance Company ("Sponsors"), One Nationwide Plaza, Columbus, Ohio 43215.

NO PURCHASE IS NECESSARY TO ENTER OR WIN. A PURCHASE WILL NOT INCREASE YOUR CHANCES OF WINNING.

ELIGIBILITY

Nominees must be Kentucky-licensed educators currently teaching agricultural education courses at the secondary (middle/high school). **No purchase is necessary**.

Nominations can be submitted by the general public, current or former students, parents, fellow educators, school administrators and community members.

TEACHERS MAY NOT SELF-NOMINATE.

The Golden Owl Award Winner (Kentucky's Agricultural Educator of the Year) will be Kentucky's representative for the NAAE Outstanding Teacher Award. If the winner is not a paid member of the Kentucky Association of Agricultural Educators, the next placed finalist that is a paid member will move to national level.

Employees, affiliates, subsidiaries, advertising and promotion agencies, and any entity involved in the development, production, implementation, administration or fulfillment of the Contest (all of the foregoing, together with Nationwide, and KY FFA Foundation collectively referred to as "Promotion Entities") and their immediate family members and/or those living in the same household of such persons, whether related or not, are not eligible to enter the Contest.

HOW TO ENTER

The Nomination period begins September 18, 2025 and ends November 30, 2025 at 11:59 p.m. PST ("Nomination Period").

To enter, provide your and the ag teacher's contact information, including an essay (250 words or less) describing how the teacher's dedication to agriculture education, and commitment and impact on today's youth make the teacher the best in the state.

Entry constitutes consent to participate in the Contest and for the KY FFA Foundation to obtain, use, and transfer the entrant's name, address and other details for Contest administration purposes. KY FFA Foundation will not be responsible for lost, incomplete, illegible, late, misdirected, stolen, or mutilated entries; technical or mechanical malfunctions; errors in the Official Rules, in any related ads or materials; or processing error. KY FFA Foundation can void the entry of any Entrant who it believes has attempted to tamper with or impair Contest administration, security, fairness, or proper play.

HONOREE DETERMINATION

Twelve (12) Honorees will be selected by an established committee.

An established committee will evaluate nominations received and select 12 Regional Honorees as defined by KY FFA's regions.

Nominations will be judged based on the following criteria:

- 1. Teacher's dedication to agriculture education
- 2. Teacher's commitment to his/her student(s)
- 3. Teacher's impact on his/her student(s)
- 4. Teacher's impact on their local community
- 5. Teacher's impact on the agriculture industry
- Number of nominations for the teacher

In the event of a tie, the teacher receiving the highest number of nominations shall be selected as Honoree, as determined by the selection committee.

12 Regional Honorees will be announced by March 31, 2026.

GRAND PRIZE WINNER DETERMINATION

Each of the 12 Regional Honorees will be required to complete a supplemental nomination form, one of whom will be chosen as the overall State winner. This completed form will be due by May 1, 2026.

Ahead of the 2026 Kentucky FFA State Convention, the committee will review supplemental nomination forms submitted and select the winner of the Kentucky Agricultural Educator of the Year. That individual's name will not be released until the 2026 Kentucky FFA State Convention held June 2026 in Lexington, KY. There the new Kentucky Agricultural Educator of the Year will be announced.

If a Prize winner is not eligible to win, or if KY FFA is unable to contact the winner after a reasonable effort, the prize will be forfeited, and an alternate winner may be selected. Odds of winning depend on the number of eligible entries received.

SPONSORS ARE NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR TRAVEL-RELATED EXPENSES ASSOCIATED WITH PRIZE ACCEPTANCE.

PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded as follows:

- 1. One (1) Grand Prize Winner: Trophy and \$3,000 cash prize to winner
- 2. Twelve (12) Honorees: Plaque and \$500 cash prize to honoree

Prizes are non-transferable, and no substitution will be made except as provided herein at the Sponsors' sole discretion. Sponsors reserve the right to substitute a prize for one of

equal or greater value if the designated prize should become unavailable for any reason. Winners are responsible for all taxes and fees associated with prize receipt and/or use.
