

We are pleased to share that the Melfort HUB has resumed its operations and is now fully active. This initiative had been suspended since COVID. The North East School Division (NESD) continues to play a pivotal role in both the Nipawin and Melfort HUBs at both organizational and operational levels.

The HUB represents a proactive and person-centered approach aimed at supporting students and families within our communities. Since its inception in 2011, HUB tables across Saskatchewan have convened on a regular schedule, to address the needs of citizens. These tables consist of professionals from various community agencies, police services, and government ministries who collaborate to discuss specific situations where elevated risk is identified.

Each meeting at the HUB table involves representatives bringing forward information about an "at-risk" individual or family through an extensive information sharing filtering process. Subsequently, the team collaboratively establishes a plan to intervene promptly and connect the individual or family to the necessary services. It is essential to understand that no single agency or service provider possesses all the requisite information, resources, or expertise to effectively address the complex social issues confronting many individuals and families. This collaborative approach exemplifies the critical role that HUB tables play in bridging these gaps.

We anticipate that the reactivation of the Melfort HUB will further enhance our interagency collaboration and enable us to continue supporting students and families in a meaningful and positive manner. We remain committed to fostering this collaborative spirit and look forward to the continued success of the HUB in serving our community.

Tisdale Family Resource Center Progress – NESD Accountable Partner Leadership

The Tisdale and Area Early Years Family Resource Centre (TAEYFRC) will be opening their newly renovated building at 903-100th Ave in Tisdale by the beginning of June. Programming has already begun in the basement of the United Church as the TAEYFRC has partnered with the Laugh and Learning Through Play CIF grant initiated by the Tisdale Early Years Partnership Committee.

The NESD has hired a half-time FRC Program Designer at the beginning of February and a full time FRC Coordinator who started at the end of February. The NESD is currently hiring a full time FRC Facilitator to assist the coordinator with programming. The Program Designer position is working closely with the Reanne Usselman, Coordinator of Learning, with strategic planning, data collection and analysis, and establishing networks and partnerships to enhance the programming at the centre.

Programming is aligned with the four pillars of the Saskatchewan EYFRCs: 1) Early Learning; 2) Family Wellness and Support; 3) Parent Education; 4) Information and Referrals. Some of our programs have included Babies & Me, Little Chefs, sensory play, literacy, and musical events. Plus, there have been professional presentations on topics such as baby dental health, co-regulation, and parenting children with big emotions. The staff is currently working with other agencies to provide families with child development and family wellness supports and information. The goal is to have some of these partners provide services within the centre.

The TAEYFRC Management Committee along with the NESD have been meeting regularly to ensure planning and implementation is aligning to the Ministry EYFRC expectations.

Ministry of Education Teacher Innovation and Support Fund Update

The Teacher Innovation and Support Fund supports teacher-led projects that help provide better student and teacher experiences in today's classrooms. This fund's goal is to have local, innovative ideas brought forward to continue enhancing our classrooms in areas like student achievement, student and teacher wellness, and school safety. Because this is once and done funding, applications include programming or practices that do not require sustained funding.

NESD teachers have submitted 12 projects to date. Three of the projects, noted below have been approved by the Ministry. (see also <u>Provincial Approval List</u>)

In partnership with Suncrest College, NESD students will be eligible to enroll in a new dual credit opportunity for the 2024-25 school year. NESD academic advisors are currently supporting student to access this course.

Dual Credit Early Childhood Education (ECE) Certificate of Achievement: Jan-June 2025

Students interested in obtaining the minimum credentials for seeking employment in a licensed daycare can take the 3 classes necessary as part of their high school programming with Suncrest College. This would be available to a maximum of 15 NESD students at no cost for the Polytechnic Courses.

How will the dual credit option work?

Suncrest College will offer the ECE Certificate of Achievement to NESD students in a synchronous cohort with a regional/online instructor in a proctored classroom at each of the three local Suncrest College campuses (Melfort, Nipawin, and Tisdale) from 1:30-3:30 pm commencing January 30th, 2025, and concluding June 26th, 2025.

Interested NESD students will be registered through Suncrest College to the Sask Polytechnic program and will be taught the three classes necessary for their letter of achievement by college staff as a physical cohort with proctored support. NESD students will work in and submit their assignments to their Suncrest Instructor using the Brightspace Learning Management System (LMS). There will be no tuition cost to students for the Sask. Polytechnic class.

NESD/local high schools will register their students through the Ministry of Education for the three locally developed/dual credit 30 level elective classes as part of their regular registration.

Suncrest College will submit all ECE course marks to Sask Polytechnic for credit and will work with NESD students to ensure that they complete the necessary paperwork to be eligible to receive their Certificate of Achievement in ECE.

2024 Mosaic School Nutrition Challenge Winner - Porcupine Plain Comprehensive School

Project Highlights:

- Implement universal snack programs
- Purchase commercial cooler
- Students lead and implement nutrition programs

"The Mosaic School Nutrition Challenge has supported student nutrition across Saskatchewan for 18 years, making it one of our longest partnerships," says Marnel Jones, Mosaic's Director of Government and Public Affairs – Canada. "Through the Challenge, students learn first-hand to grow food, the importance of nutrition, and have the opportunity to create healthy environments in their schools. Congratulations to this year's ten winning schools."

The winning projects have goals including implementing or extending nutrition programs, promoting cooking and gardening, enhancing facilities, increasing educational opportunities, and supporting projects with cultural components. These will be supported by the grants.

For the total of \$150,000 in prizes provided by Mosaic, schools from across the province submitted their projects to compete. Schools receiving grants this year are governed by the Horizon, Ile-a-la Crosse, North East, Prairie Spirit, Prairie Valley, Regina Catholic, Regina Public, Saskatchewan Rivers, and Saskatoon Public school boards and the Meadow Lake Tribal Council.

This program began in 2006 to encourage grassroots initiatives to help improve student nutrition.

"We see amazing ideas and initiatives continue to come forward in this 18th year of the Mosaic Challenge," said Jaimie Smith-Windsor, president of the SSBA. "We are grateful for Mosaic's ongoing commitment."

Prairie North Co-op not only supplies the necessary ingredients but also takes the initiative to do a significant amount of the work necessary to prepare school snacks. This invaluable





several years ago. He had followed the progress and work of HBCS through Elder Corinne Severight. He sent the following expert to CBC news. In a conversation he shared with our School Principal Louise Gel, lots of people now acknowledge September 30 as a day for Truth and Reconciliation however what makes our school different is that we honor the truth and continued Education all year long.

Letter from Tony Stevenson - Residential School Survivor

"There is a school in Hudson Bay Saskatchewan that is by far, the greatest example of what real truth and reconciliation means. The principal, Ms. Louise Gel, is a true definition of an educator. Her determination to make a positive difference for her student's future and the community's educational core values is a template that should be followed by the provinces, or better yet, the country.

Of course, it takes several people to carry that mindset with compassion to make this a reality. The students embraced the residential school history presented to them, and their open minds created the initiative to learn more. The fellow teachers and staff of the school are also responsible for harbouring a very safe, positive learning environment. Many community members are also very open-minded and empathetic towards the teachings of the residential school history. They no doubt, deserve some serious recognition for the work and efforts they have also put into the effort.

Last, but not least, I'd like to recognize my fellow First Nation family member from the Cote First Nation, Ms. Corrine Severight. The school, members of the community, and the local museum have embraced her endless knowledge and first-hand experience to carry on the act of reconciliation. The education and the lived experience that she has attained through her life experiences have allowed her to be one of the top educators to all the students and members of the community.


Moments like these remind us that connection is more than just a value—it's an action. By taking the time to engage, support, and celebrate one another, we strengthen the bonds that unite us.



Celebrating Connections – NESSAC (North East Sask Schools Athletic Conference)

The NESD has had an outstanding 2024–25 school year thus far, filled with remarkable sports achievements. In a historic 9-Aside Provincial Football final, Melfort and Tisdale met for the first time, with Melfort claiming gold and Tisdale earning silver. Volleyball was highly competitive, as Melfort's 4A boys' and 4A girls' teams both won regionals, with the girls later securing a silver medal at provincials. Other provincial qualifiers included nearly 40 cross-country athletes, the Melfort boys' curling team, and golfers from Nipawin, Melfort, and Hudson Bay. Several communities hosted key events, including 2A girls' volleyball conferences in Naicam, 3A girls' volleyball conferences and regionals in Carrot River, 4A girls' and boys' volleyball regionals in Melfort, and 1A boys' basketball regionals in Porcupine Plain. Wrestling reached a historic milestone as Carrot River hosted the first-ever regional event in the NESD, where one girl won her weight category, and the Carrot River boys earned the 3A team award. Carrot River sent five wrestlers to provincials, bringing home two silver medals, while Nipawin also sent a competitor.

Celebrating Connection – Student Led Conferences at Central Park Elementary, Nipawin

Prior to SLCs, teachers invited families to sign up to celebrate and reflect on their students' learning journeys. Classrooms from Pre-K to Grade 3 were set up in a variety of stations where students, parents and even siblings joined in different learning tasks which included learning through play and creating, sorting and counting, story sequencing, using success criteria to highlight math skills, sharing examples of growth in writing and other areas of literacy, as well as reflecting on learning.




