In delivering an early intervention drug, alcohol, nicotine, and violence prevention program to fifth grade students, and by processing the issues of good sportsmanship, civility, bullying, and teasing, the student-athlete leaders of Athletes Helping Athletes seek to encourage students to stay in school, avoid substance abuse and violence, as well as be respectful of both themselves and others. It is the mission of the student-athlete role models to inspire the youth in our community to make healthy choices, positive decisions, and to have respectful interactions; and consequently, improve the quality of life in our community. To be considered for membership into Athletes Helping Athletes you must go through a selection process. The process starts with a nomination from a coach, submission of a writing sample, and completion of a peer interview by current members of Athletes Helping Athletes and the advisors.

Backyard Games Club

Business Honor Society

The primary purpose of the Business and Marketing Honor Society of New York State is to recognize students who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in business education at the secondary level.

BMHS Eligibility

- Students must be currently enrolled in at least one business education (fall and/or spring) course
- Seniors: Must complete 3 units in Business Education by the end of the current school Year
- Sophomores/Juniors: Must complete 2 units in Business Education by the end of the current school year and should be planning to enroll in at least one additional unit prior to graduation.

BMHS Criteria

- In Business Education courses: Minimum of 88 percent or B+ or 3.5 GPA /Overall: 80 percent or B or 3.0 GPA
- Students should demonstrate exemplary Character, Leadership, and Service in the classroom as well as in co-curricular and extracurricular activities
- Business and Marketing Honor Society members may be required to provide service to the community, co-curricular, or extra-curricular activities to maintain membership.

Change For Tomorrow

Our season extends through early November, featuring performances at all home football games with the marching band, the HHS Pep Rally, Homecoming Day Parade, and the Newsday Marching Band Festival. Additional performances may be scheduled throughout the season. Kickline members must also take part in the Greenlawn and Centerport Memorial Day Parades in May. Active membership requires satisfactory participation in all classes, demonstrated by appropriate behavior and passing grades on progress reports.

Literary Magazine - Zephyr Club

The members compete in the New York State Math League and the American Mathematics Competition. The club meets bimonthly on Tuesdays.

Mindfulness Club

National Honor Society

The Gloria Vavasseur chapter of National Honor Society is composed of a select group of students who demonstrate excellence in scholarship, leadership, service, and character. Students are eligible to apply for membership at the end of their sophomore year. Applicants must have a minimum of a 90.0 weighted average, and must exhibit active participation in their school and their community. NHS members are required to complete a 10-hour individual service project, 8 hours of school-based community service and 2 hours of peer tutoring each year to maintain their membership. The club meets monthly, and regular attendance is required for all members. Some of the activities that the National Honor Society participates in include: HHS Open School Night, Earth Day Cleanup, PTSA Board Meeting Babysitting, Safe Halloween, the Washington Drive 2nd Grade Carnival, Autism Awareness Day, Community 5K Run and Pancake Breakfast, and HACO toy and clothing drive.

Natural Helpers

Advisors: Dr. Koenig & Mr. Barrett

The Natural Helpers program is based on a simple premise: Within every school, an informal "helping network" exists. Students with problems naturally seek out other students—and occasionally teachers or other school staff—whom they trust. They seek them out for advice, for assistance, or just for a sympathetic ear. The Natural Helpers program uses this existing helping network; it provides training to students and adults who are already identified as "natural" helpers. It gives them the skills they need to provide help more effectively to young people who seek them out. Natural Helpers are a cross section of students and school adults identified through an anonymous school - wide survey. After representatives of all the subgroups in the school community are selected, they are invited to participate in the Natural Helpers program. They receive at least 30 hours of training in a retreat setting; there they learn how to improve their helping skills, suicide prevention, and how to contact helping resources when problems exceed their limits, and how to better care for themselves. Natural Helpers are not professionally trained therapists or counselors. Once a Natural Helper attends the training retreat, they are then able to participate in the program and attend weekly follow-up meetings for on-going guidance and training.

Pet Awareness Club (PAC)

Advisor: Mr. Barrett & Ms. Cornell

The Harborfields Pet Awareness Club's (HFPAC) main focus is to educate the student body and community about issues pertaining to pets and other animals. Through various fundraisers and public relations campaigns, students will work to raise awareness and money/supplies for local animal shelters and programs that work for the welfare of animals. The club will also bring in guest speakers to educate its members and speak about volunteer and career choices that involve working with animals. There will be opportunities for community service as well. Students, grade 9-12, who are passionate about animals or are considering a career in working with animals, are encouraged to join.

Photojournalism Club

Members of the Photojournalism Club produce the annual Senior Video for the graduating students to watch on the last day of school. Students from each grade (new members are always welcome) take and collect photos to document student life at HHS. We need organized, creative, students with a strong interest in Photography and Video Editing to help work on the video for their graduating class. That means we want participants from each grade to get involved in our club!

Playfest

PlayFest is a competition and festival of plays written, directed, produced, and performed by the students. One original student written play is selected per grade level to be performed. Rehearsals are after school. Students, family, and community members are welcome to attend our January performance. This club is open to all experience levels. Students must be available to audition for roles, participate in after school rehearsals based on their grade level's day and time slot, be available for all dress rehearsals, and the final performance.

Psychology Club

The Psychology Club is a welcoming space for students at all grade levels who are interested in psychology and who want to be involved in generating support for mental health issues. Members participate in *P.S. I Love You* week events, Mental Health/Brain Awareness months, and fundraisers throughout the year with the goal of making a donation to a local or regional mental health organization. We also host guest speakers from the field of psychology who share their insights and experience with members. Whether you're passionate about helping others or just enjoy talking about what makes people tick, Psychology Club is a great way to connect with others and make a positive impact!

Rho Kappa: Social Studies Honor Society

Students in their Junior and Senior years are invited to apply to the chapter on the basis of their past academic performance in their Social Studies classes. To be eligible, students must have completed at least one Advanced Placement Social Studies course at HHS, an unweighted GPA of 95 or higher in required Social Studies classes taken, and a cumulative unweighted GPA of 90 or higher. Members are required to take part in at least 3 community service projects organized by the membership. The induction ceremony will take place in the fall.
