Text does not need to be numbered.

The introduction should provide a clear background, a clear problem statement, relevant literature on the subject, the proposed approach or solution, and the new value of the research, which constitutes an innovation. Citations and references are created using the Mendeley or Zotero application in APA style.

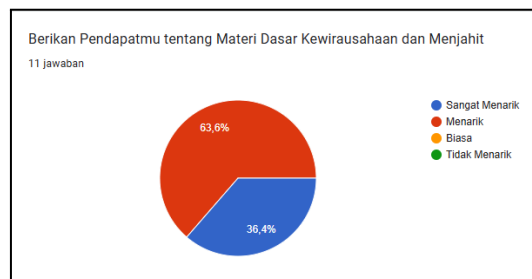
