



## Local Agency Breastfeeding Training Ideas

As a Breastfeeding Coordinator, you may be seeking ideas for meeting quarterly breastfeeding training opportunities for ALL your staff. Don't get overwhelmed by the need: you can grab a pump and review how it is assembled and cleaned during a regular staff meeting, or you can discuss ideas for decorating the lab to promote breastfeeding and discuss why there is a need to encourage breastfeeding families and not, inadvertently, discourage them. The possibilities are endless, and they don't have to require a lot of advanced preparation. A favorite idea is to have "Breastfeeding Briefings" where 1-2 case studies from the past week's clients are discussed. Include clerk and tech involvement and any assessments and interventions that were implemented. Lastly, be sure to document who was present for the education. The mission of [First Droplets](#) by Dr. Jane Morton is to encourage parents to take advantage of the first few days after birth, critical window period, to use the most effective breastfeeding techniques to prevent common challenges. It is a great website to refer clients to for additional learning.
  - a. There are 6 different videos which could be used for client educational purposes.
  - b. The video called "A Mother's Touch, Breastfeeding in the First Hour" (11:50) could be used prenatally. It covers the importance of the first hour after birth, skin to skin, latch, positioning, hand expression, feeding expressed colostrum with a spoon, sleepy babies, separation of mom and baby, boosting milk production and providing breast milk to baby.
