2023-2024 Remediation Options

- 1. Builder Bucks students have an opportunity to earn builder bucks when they help clean up lunch or earn them in the classrooms. It costs 40 builder bucks to remediate one tardy.
- 2. Parent Empowerment Meetings we will remove up to 3 tardies for each parent/student who attends a meeting. These are announced in the newsletter.
- 3. Parent Teacher Conferences each conference attended will remove one tardy (up to 8 per PTC session, depending on how many classes they take).

Tardies

- 1) Secondary students are allowed five minutes between class periods. By the second bell students are expected to be:
 - a) seated at their desks,
 - b) with the necessary materials ready (pencil, book, binder),
 - c) in full school uniform (name tag, shirt tucked in, etc.), and
 - d) working on the bell ringer activity.
 - i) Students who are not present and prepared at the beginning of class may be marked tardy for that class.
- 2) Each class is evaluated independently.
- 3) If a student accumulates a total of four or more tardies in any class, the grade for the class will be changed to NC (no credit) and will remain as NC until the student fulfills the requirements to remove the NC.
- 4) The No Credit (NC) will remain as the letter grade for that class unless:
 - a) the student fulfills the requirements of attendance school (see Attendance School policy), or
 - b) completes assigned Academic Work to make up for the lost academic time.
- 5) The school administrator will review each NC by the end of each term and change the NC to a posted grade if the student has fulfilled the requirements of attendance school.
- 6) The school administrator will review each NC remaining at the end of the school year and if make-up Academic Work is completed at some point prior to the commencement of the next academic year, will change the NC to the grade that will provide the greatest academic benefit to the student:
 - a) the earned grade in the course, or
 - b) the Pass grade from the make-up Academic Work.

Attendance School - Secondary

- 1. Attendance school is a service provided to assist students in clearing their attendance record from excessive tardies. When a student is tardy more than four times to a class, their grade is changed to NC (no credit).
- 2. Students may clear their attendance record from the NC by attending Attendance School.
- 3. Attendance school is typically held on Saturday mornings from 7 a.m. to 10 a.m. during the second half of the term.
- 4. Attendance school hours will be posted in the secondary offices and published in the newsletter.
- 5. To make up each tardy, students may be required to pay a tardy fee (53G-7-501(6)(b)(vi)) and attend 30 minutes of Attendance School.
- 6. No students will be admitted late to Attendance School.
- 7. During attendance school, students must wear full uniform and must work quietly or read.
- 8. No electronics are allowed in Attendance School.
- 9. If a student is talking, sleeping, or using their cell phones or other personal electronics during attendance school, they will be excused and their attendance record will not be cleared. The student can attend a future Attendance School to clear their attendance record.
- 10. Each half hour of attendance school clears 1 tardy from the student's record if attendance school is completed during the term in which the NC was assigned.
- 11. A full hour of attendance school clears 1 tardy from the student's record if attendance school is completed outside of the term in which the NC was assigned.
- 12. Sluffs (not attending class and absent parental permission) require an hour of Attendance School to remove 1 Sluff.
- 13. Upon successful completion of the needed hours of Attendance School during the term in which the NC was assigned, the NC will be removed and the student's earned letter grade will reappear.
- 14. Students who fail to complete Attendance School during any quarter of the school year may be assigned Academic Work and upon successful completion the NC may be removed. More information can be found on the Tardy School policy.
