The Plymouth Land Bank Group (Steve Bolotin, Kevin Canty, David Golden, Harry Helm)

are proposing legislation for a **Plymouth Land Bank** and an Executive Summary outlining its key provisions. The goal of the Land Bank is to help address critical land needs in Plymouth without putting a greater financial burden on residents. The ideas for this Land Bank came from discussions with residents, Town and State officials, and a review of similar entities throughout the country. It should be stressed that this is a <u>proposal to be discussed</u>. After community input the final version will be presented to Town Meeting for their vote (planned for fall Town Meeting). If approved, it would then have to be submitted to the State legislature as a Home Rule Petition (where it may be rejected or subject to further amendment). If approved at the State level, the final version would go to a final town-wide vote.

We look forward to presenting this proposal to Town boards, committees, and organizations in the coming weeks and to working with the community towards protecting open space, creating genuinely affordable housing, and appropriately managing growth and development.
